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Disclosure of Information Guidelines

Section 37.1 - A custodian may disclose information that relates to the possible commission of an offence and the **disclosure will prevent fraud and limit abuse in the use of the health service** include the following:

- The name of an individual
- The date of birth of an individual
- The personal health number of an individual
- The nature of any injury or illness of an individual
- The date on which a health services was sought or received by an individual
- The location where a health services was sought or received by an individual
- The name of any drug defined in the Pharmacy and Drug Act, provided to or prescribed for an individual and the date the drug was provided or prescribed
- Information specified in section 1(1)(i)(ii) about a health service provider who provided the health service to an individual referred in subsection (1).

Section 37.3 - A custodian may disclose information that relates to the possible commission of an offence and the **disclosure will protect the health and safety of Albertans**, include the following:

- The name of an individual
- The date of birth of an individual
- The nature of any injury or illness of an individual
- The date the service was sought or received by the individual
- The location where an individual sought or received a health service
- Whether any samples of bodily substances were taken from the individual (Confirm or deny; does not include the disclosure of test results)
- Information specified in Section 1 (1)(i)(ii) about a health services provider who provided a health service to an individual referred to in subsection (1).
