Name of Measure	Access to continuing care: Number of people waiting in an acute care / subacute hospital bed for continuing care.		
Name of Measure (short)	Number of people waiting in an acute care / subacute hospital bed for continuing care.		
Definition	The number of people waiting in an acute care / sub acute hospital bed for continuing care is defined as the number of individual persons assessed and approved for publicly funded continuing care living options who are waiting in acute care and sub-acute care hospital beds at a specific point in time. These acute care and sub-acute care hospital beds include acute care beds, palliative care beds, transition beds, and acute mental health beds (such as beds at Alberta Hospital Edmonton, or at the Centennial Centre for Mental Health and Brain Injury). Continuing care is defined as including Supportive Living Level 3, Supportive Living Level 4, Supportive Living Level 4 Dementia, and Long Term Care Facility Care. The total number of people waiting for continuing care, and the total number of people waiting for each type of continuing care, are to calculated on the last day of the month in each quarter of a given fiscal year; that is, on the last day of June, September, December, and March. Individual persons will be assessed as needing continuing care according to the AHS "Admission Guidelines for Publicly Funded Continuing Care Living Options", and then waitlisted according to current available continuing care living options.

Rationale	Goal 2 of Alberta's 5_year Health Action Plan is that "All Albertans requiring continuing care will have access to appropriate option for (continuing) care within one month (30 days) (p. 11). To support achievement of this goal, the Government of Alberta and Alberta Health services will add and refurbish more long-term care beds and supportive living spaces, with the expected benefit to Albertans that fewer people will wait in hospital beds for continuing care. By 2014-2015, the target is 250 people waiting is hospital beds for continuing care. This performance measure is used to monitor and report on progress toward reducing this goal. Access to continuing care service is a major issue in Alberta. By improving access to a few		
	key areas AHS will be able to improve flow throughout the system, provide more appropriate care, decrease wait times and deliver care in a more cost effective manner. AHS wants to offer seniors and persons with disabilities more options for quality accommodations that suit their lifestyles and service needs.

Inclusion Criteria for Numerator	Includes people who have been assessed and approved for publicly funded continuing care living option, and who are waiting in an acute care /sub-acute hospital bed for continuing care. These acute care and sub-acute care hospital beds include acute care beds, palliative care beds, transition beds, and acute mental health beds (such as beds at Alberta Hospital Edmonton, or at the Centennial Centre for Mental Health and Brain Injury).		
Exclusion Criteria for Numerator	People who are in the process of being assessed and approved for publicly funded continuing care living options		
	 People waiting in acute or sub-acute bed in another zone (or former region) for placement within the reporting zone. This is to avoid double counting. 		
	 People waiting in community mental health facilities such as Raymond Centre or Claresholm Centre for Mental Health and Addictions 		
	• People waiting for home care services (inclusive of Supportive Living Levels 1 and 2)		
	 People waiting in acute for a transfer to a sub acute unit or a rehab unit for rehabilitation 		
	 People waiting in an acute care bed/service for another acute care bed/service (e.g., surgical bed to a medical bed) 		
	 People waiting in a tertiary acute care hospital bed for transfer to a non-tertiary acute care hospital bed (e.g., repatriation to community hospital)

Data Source(s) for Numerator	Data is provided by Alberta Health Services' Zones, according to the nine former health regions. North, South and Central Zones use MediTech, and some manual and semi-automated data collection. Calgary and Edmonton Zones use Strata Health – Pathways. Reports are provided to DIMR, and manually collated into Microsoft Excel spreadsheets.		
Refresh Rate of Numerator	The Zones provide the data by the 10 th of the following month, and the consolidated monthly report is available by the 15 th of the following month.

Calculation	The number of persons waiting in an acute care / sub acute hospital bed for continuing care is calculated as the arithmetic sum, at a specific point in time, of the total number of individual persons assessed and approved for publicly funded continuing care who are waiting in an acute care, or a sub-acute care hospital bed, for any of the following types of continuing care: Supportive living (SL) level 3, Supportive living (SL) level 4 Supportive living dementia (SLD) level 4 Long term care (LTC) facility care. The specific point in time when the number of people waiting for continuing care is to be calculated is the last day of the month of each quarter in a fiscal year; that is, the last day of June, September, December, and March in a given fiscal year. The last day of March (March 31) in a given fiscal year is the date to be used in calculation of the result for this measure to be reported in the annual reports of the Government of Alberta, Alberta Health and Wellness, and Alberta Health Services.		
Relationship to Other Indicators	This measure is related to the measure of the number of people waiting in the community for continuing care.		
Level of Reporting	AHW – Provincial and Zone, by type of continuing care needed. AHS – Provincial, Zone, and Hospital, by type of continuing care needed. Types of continuing care reported are to include: Supportive living (SL) level 3 Supportive living (SL) level 4 Supportive living dementia (SLD) level 4 Long term care (LTC) facility care.

Limitations	Currently data is collected according to the nine former health regions and collated manually to obtain a provincial count of the number of people waiting for continuing care. There may be issues with the accuracy, validity and reliability of the designation of patients waiting in acute and subacute care beds for continuing care due to variations in current availability of supportive living options, as well as variations in methods of recording patient status over the reporting period. It is not possible to analyze data at the level of individual persons waiting for continuing		
	care. Summary data only are provided.
