# 4. [FC16-53] September 30, 2016 – Second Quarter Investment Report

UPON MOTION duly moved, seconded and unanimously carried the Alberta Health Services Board ratified the investment portfolio and transactions described below, and as certified by signed investment compliance certificates from AHS and Phillips, Hager & North Investment Management:

- a) as at September 30, 2016, AHS held restricted and unrestricted funds managed by Phillips, Hager & North Investment Management and Standard Life Canada totalling \$1.462 billion;
- b) the funds were invested in short term treasury bills, federal, provincial and corporate fixed income bonds, pooled mortgage funds, bond funds, Canadian and Global equity funds; and
- c) all of the funds invested during the quarter ended September 30, 2016, were invested in accordance with the Investment Bylaw and Investments Policy as certified by signed investment compliance certificates from AHS and Phillips, Hager & North Investment Management.

# 5. [FC16-54] Protective Services Contract Extension with Paladin Security Group

UPON MOTION duly moved, seconded and unanimously carried the Alberta Health Services Board:

- a) approved a one year extension to the current Paladin Security Group contract; and
- b) delegated signing authority of the extension to the President and Chief Executive Officer.
