

Undergraduate Nursing Employee (UNE) Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is an undergraduate nursing employee (UNE)?

A UNE is an employee who must be a nursing student enrolled in an accredited Alberta nursing program to be eligible for employment. The UNE works in a health care setting under the supervision of a Registered Nurse (RN) or Registered Psychiatric Nurse (RPN).

2. What are the minimum qualifications that are necessary to be a UNE?

The UNE must meet the minimum qualifications listed in the [Undergraduate Nursing Employee \(UNE\) Provincial Description](#) which include:

- Current enrollment in an approved Alberta nursing education program leading to initial entry to practice as a registered nurse or registered psychiatric nurse.
- Current Healthcare Provider Basic Life Support (CPR) certificate.

RN Program

- Successful completion of 3rd year of an RN nursing education program AND
- minimum of 600 hours of clinical practice in an approved RN education program.

OR

- Currently in final year of an after-degree RN nursing education program AND
- minimum of 600 hours of clinical practice in an approved RN education program.

RPN Program

- Successful completion of 2nd year of an RPN nursing education program AND
- minimum of 600 hours of clinical practice in an approved RPN education program.

UNEs applying for high acuity practice areas or specialty areas within AHS may require experience specific to the 600 hours of clinical practice. i.e., Student has completed 2 Medical/Surgical rotations successfully (this would count as hours toward the 600 hour requirement). This potential requirement is at the discretion of the Manager within the Alberta Health Services practice environment. 3. What documentation will be required prior to starting a UNE position?

- Active enrolment verification;
- Current Healthcare Provider Basic Life Support (CPR) certificate;
- UNE Clinical Hours Confirmation form (including minimum required clinical hours and year completed in nursing education program).
- Minimum of two clear reference checks;
- Immunization Record in accordance to Workplace Health & Safety requirements; and
- Police Information Check including Vulnerable Sector Search, dated no earlier than ninety (90) days prior to commencement of employment.
