



### SETTING THE CONTEXT

#### Strategic Clinical Networks™ (SCN)

Strategic Clinical Networks are provincial in scope and include small leadership teams bringing together the experiences and expertise of front line healthcare professionals, researchers, government, communities, clinical and non-clinical leaders, patients and their families, to improve Alberta's healthcare system. There are currently 15 of these "Engines of Health Innovation", creating improvements within focused areas of health care.

#### Transformational Road Maps

Transformational Road Maps (TRM) are three year strategic frameworks outlining the actions that guide network activities to improve health outcomes for all Albertans. Thirteen SCNs have TRMs, and recently launched SCNs are in the process of development.

#### The Priority Setting Process

SCNs have been challenged to find new and innovative ways of delivering health care providing better quality, better health outcomes, and better value for every Albertan.

In the summer of 2012, processes and a toolkit to support priority setting were developed by Planning and Performance, and Strategic Clinical Network leadership. These tools were designed to help newly formed SCNs determine priorities.

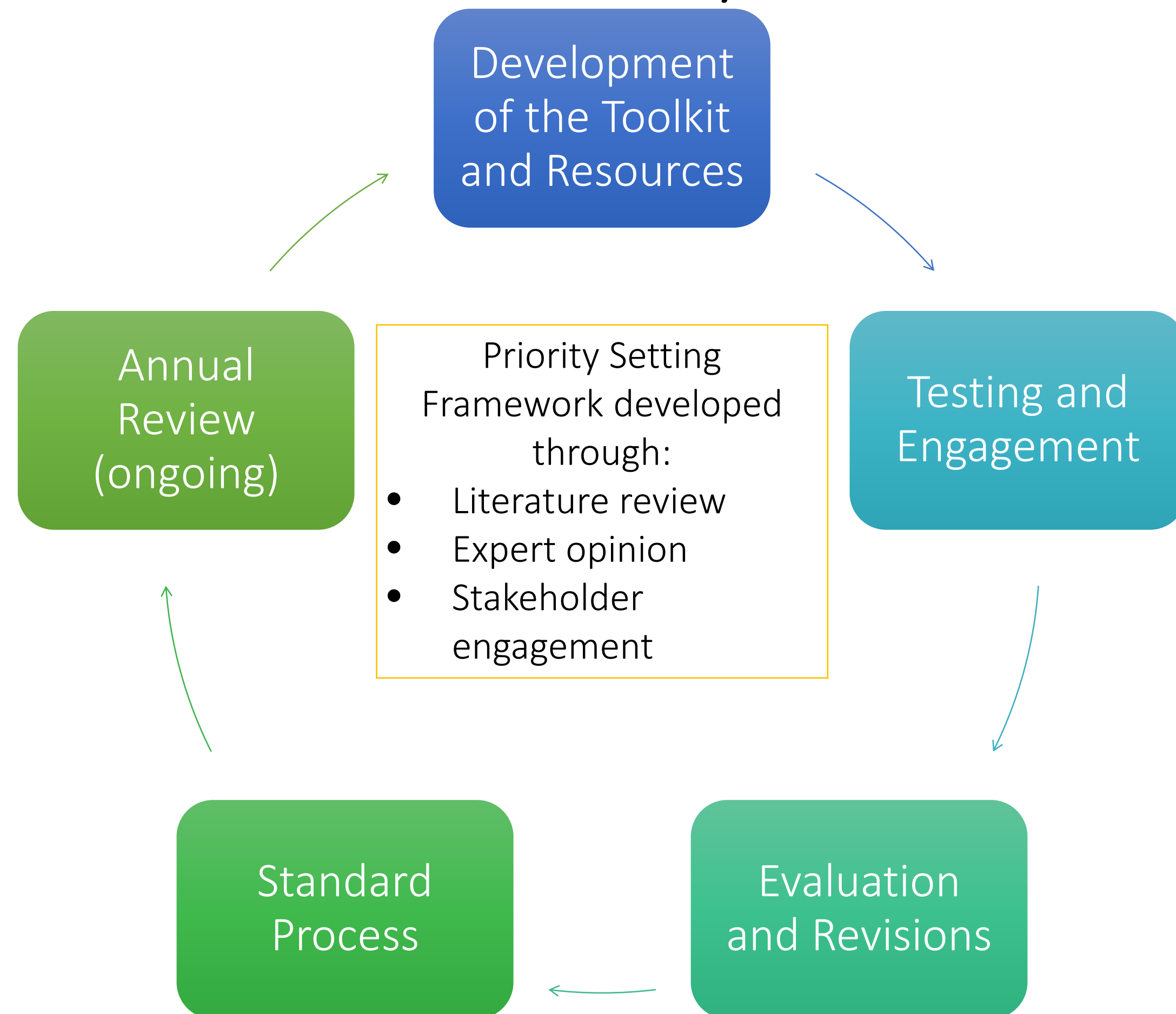
Priority setting is now an established process embedded within the development of the TRMs.

- Cost implication

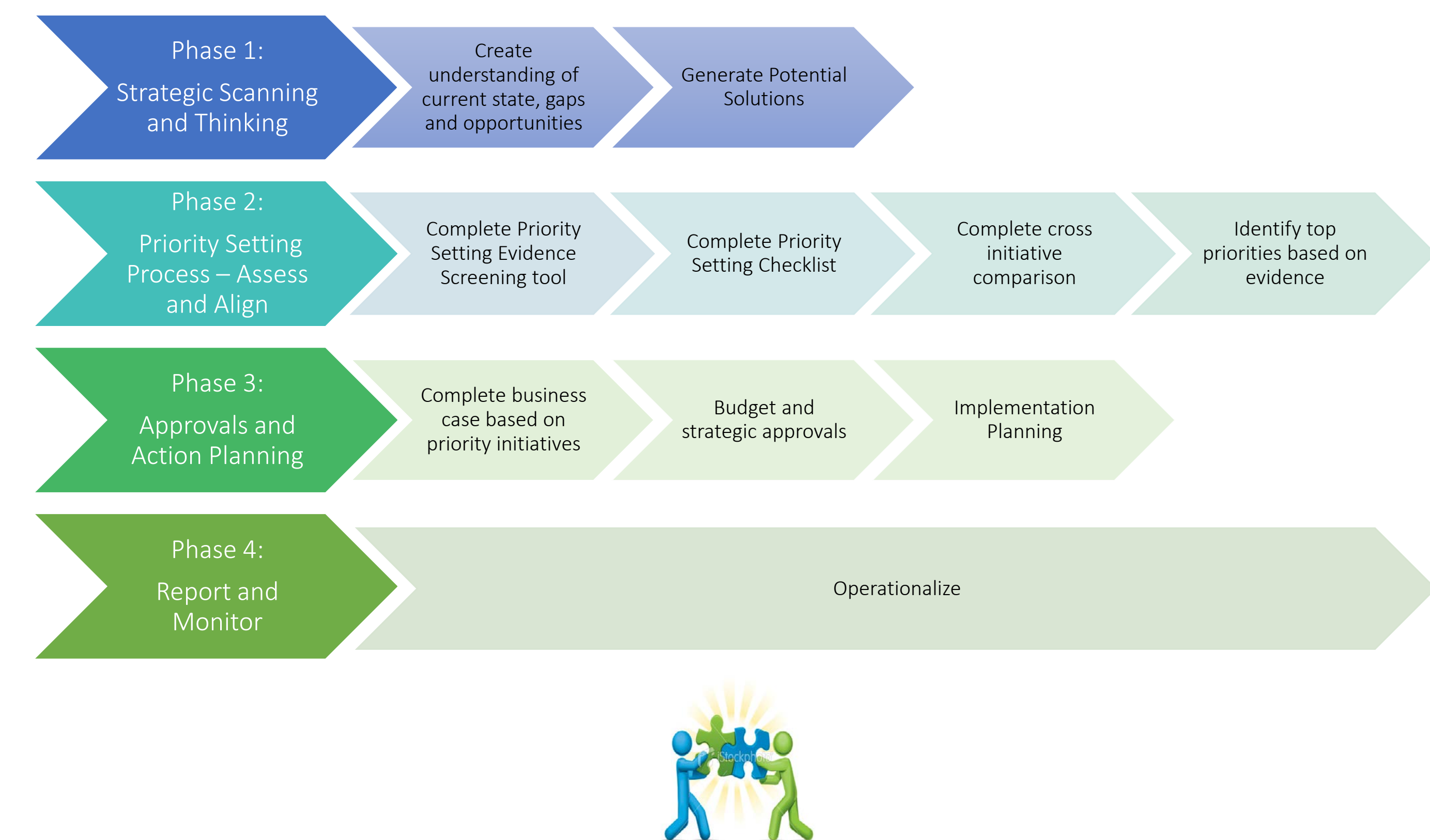

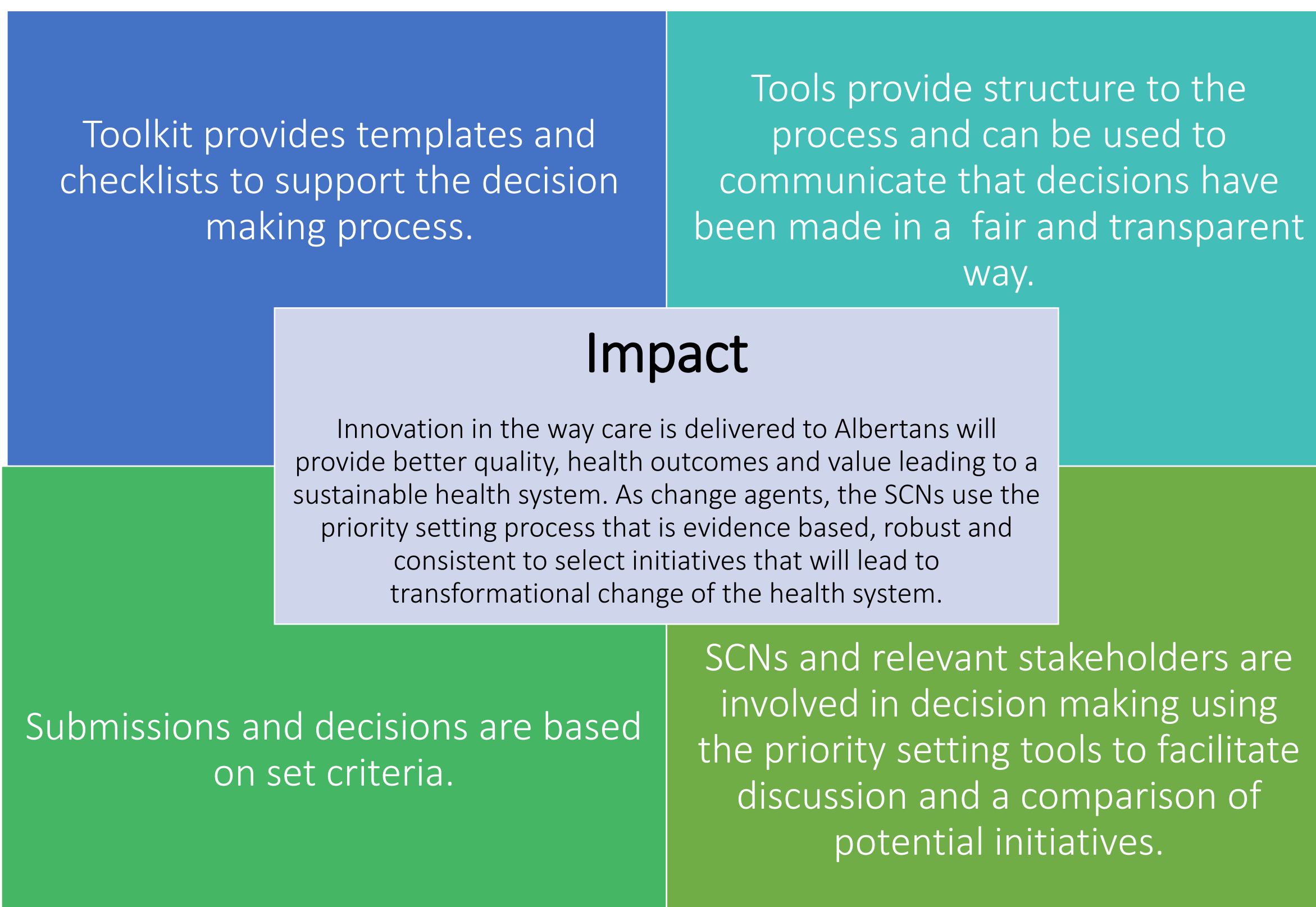


Health Quality Council of Alberta's Six Dimensions of Quality

#### Lessons Learned
