

Strategic Clinical Networks[™] (SCN)

Strategic Clinical Networks are provincial in scope and include small leadership teams bringing together the experiences and expertise of front line healthcare professionals, researchers, government, communities, clinical and non-clinical leaders, patients and their families, to improve Alberta's healthcare system. There are currently 15 of these "Engines of Health" Innovation", creating improvements within focused areas of health care.

Transformational Road Maps

Transformational Road Maps (TRM) are three year strategic frameworks outlining the actions that guide network activities to improve health outcomes for all Albertans. Thirteen SCNs have TRMs, and recently launched SCNs are in the process of development.



Toolkit provides templates and checklists to support the decision making process.

Tools provide structure to the process and can be used to communicate that decisions have been made in a fair and transparent way.

Impact

Innovation in the way care is delivered to Albertans will provide better quality, health outcomes and value leading to a sustainable health system. As change agents, the SCNs use the priority setting process that is evidence based, robust and consistent to select initiatives that will lead to transformational change of the health system.

Submissions and decisions are based on set criteria.

SCNs and relevant stakeholders are involved in decision making using the priority setting tools to facilitate discussion and a comparison of potential initiatives.


SETTING THE CONTEXT

The Priority Setting Process

SCNs have been challenged to find new and innovative ways of delivering health care providing better quality, better health outcomes, and better value for every Albertan.

In the summer of 2012, processes and a toolkit to support priority setting were developed by Planning and Performance, and Strategic Clinical Network leadership. These tools were designed to help newly formed SCNs determine priorities.

Priority setting is now an established process embedded within the development of the TRMs.

Decision Making Criteria

The priority setting tools facilitate decision making by assessing a potential initiative based on the following criteria:

- Evidence as it aligns to the Health Quality Council of Alberta's six dimensions of quality
- Feasibility
- Health equity
- Cost implication



Lessons Learned



- Tools need to be simple yet able to capture enough information for decisions to be made.
- Further information was required to support the process, which resulted in the addition of support tools.
- Although there is consistency with the tools, how they are utilized requires a tailored approach to the specific needs of the SCN.
- The tools are consistently monitored for alignment with AHS strategic goals and objectives, as well as relevance to the SCNs.
