

ORDER OF AN EXECUTIVE OFFICER

To: Tina Ho "the Owner"

RE: Those housing premises located in Calgary, Alberta and municipally described as:

1306 35 Street SE - Basement

WHEREAS I, an Executive Officer of Alberta Health Services, have inspected the above noted premises pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Act, RSA 2000, c. P-37, as amended;

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following conditions exist in and about the above noted premises which are or may become injurious or dangerous to the public health or which might hinder in any manner the prevention or suppression of disease, namely:

- a. Raw plywood flooring was exposed in the hallway near the southwest bedroom.
- b. The caulking around the shower surround was mouldy.
- c. Unable to test the kitchen stove as all the knobs were missing.
- d. The kitchen sink was clogged, and the plumbing below was fixed with duct tape.
- e. The washroom hand sink was clogged.
- f. The showerhead was leaking.
- g. There was no smoke alarm near any bedrooms.
- h. The door frame around the southeast bedroom was severely damaged.
- i. The northwest bedroom door was severely damaged.

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following breaches of the Public Health Act and the Housing Regulation, Alberta Regulation 173/99, and the Minimum Housing and Health Standards exist in and about the above noted premises, namely:

- a. Raw plywood flooring was exposed in the hallway near the southwest bedroom. This is a contravention of section III(5) of the Minimum Housing and Health Standards which states that: All walls, windows, ceilings, floors, and floor coverings shall be maintained in good repair, free of cracks, holes, loose or lifting coverings and in a condition that renders it easy to clean.
- b. The caulking around the shower surround was mouldy. This is a contravention of section section III(1)(c) of the Minimum Housing and Health Standards which states that: Building materials that have been damaged or show evidence of rot or other deterioration shall be repaired or replaced.
- c. Unable to test the kitchen stove as all the knobs were missing. This is a contravention of section IV(14)(a)(iv) of the Minimum Housing and Health Standards which states that: Every housing premises shall be provided with a food preparation area, which includes: a stove and a refrigerator that are maintained in a safe and proper operating condition. The refrigerator shall be capable of maintaining a temperature of 4 degrees C.
- d. The kitchen sink was clogged, and the plumbing below was fixed with duct tape. This is a contravention section IV(6)(a) of the Minimum Housing and Health Standards which states that: The plumbing system and the sanitary drainage system or private sewage disposal system, as the case may be, including drains, fixtures, traps, vents, stacks, waste disposal

- facilities, pumpout sewage holding tanks, septic tanks and the disposal system shall be maintained in a proper operating condition.
- e. The washroom hand sink was clogged. This is a contravention of section IV(6)(a) of the Minimum Housing and Health Standards which states that: The plumbing system and the sanitary drainage system or private sewage disposal system, as the case may be, including drains, fixtures, traps, vents, stacks, waste disposal facilities, pumpout sewage holding tanks, septic tanks and the disposal system shall be maintained in a proper operating condition.
- f. The showerhead was leaking. This is a contravention of section IV(6)(c) of the Minimum Housing and Health Standards which states that: All plumbing fixtures shall be serviceable, free from leaks, trapped and vented to the outside.
- g. There was no smoke alarm near any bedrooms. This is a contravention of section IV(12) of the Minimum Housing and Health Standards which states that: Smoke alarms within dwellings shall be installed between each sleeping area and the remainder of the suite and, where hallways serve the sleeping areas; the smoke alarms shall be installed within the hallway.
- h. The door frame around the southeast bedroom was severely damaged. This is a contravention of section III(1)(c) of the Minimum Housing and Health Standards which states that: Building materials that have been damaged or show evidence of rot or other deterioration shall be repaired or replaced.
- i. The northwest bedroom door was severely damaged. This is a contravention of section III(1)(c) of the Minimum Housing and Health Standards which states that: Building materials that have been damaged or show evidence of rot or other deterioration shall be repaired or replaced.

NOW THEREFORE, I hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT**:

- 1. That the Owner immediately undertake and diligently pursue the completion of the following work in and about the above noted premises, namely:
 - a. Install new flooring material near the southwest bedroom.
 - b. Remove old caulking around the shower surround and re-seal with new material.
 - c. Repair or replace kitchen stove.
 - d. Repair or replace the kitchen sink so it is in good working condition.
 - e. Repair or replace the washroom hand sink so it is in good working condition.
 - f. Repair or replace the shower faucet so it is no longer leaking.
 - g. Install fully functional smoke alarms near all bedrooms.
 - h. Replace door frame around the southeast bedroom.
 - i. Repair or replace northwest bedroom door.
- 2. The work referred to in paragraph 1 shall be completed by January 8, 2024.

The above conditions were noted at the time of inspection and may not necessarily reflect all deficiencies. You are advised that further work may be required to ensure full compliance with the Public Health Act and regulations, or to prevent a public health nuisance.
