### **Questions and Comments:**

### Are the 10 beds in addition to the 108 added to Willow Square and what needs do they address?

The beds are local to the region and do not include midwifery/demographics/panels of physicians/local team supports aging population/supportive living care in long term care.

# Is there a decline in birth rates in Fort McMurray?

The birth rate is trending down not only in Fort McMurray, but per capita.

Todd will forward demographic trends from 2018 – 2021 to Council. The next municipal census is scheduled for 2024.

# Are Emergency Room wait times going to be displayed on a dashboard?

The upcoming Connect Care launch will address wait times.

# **Patient Flow:**

Northern Lights Regional Health Centre (NLRHC) displays patient flow, admittance to bed, etc. There are bottle necks for discharge or social complexity for safety. ALOSS/ELOSS. Allied Health resources help with OT, speech and other treatments.

# Will some of the patient flow be improved with the addition of new transition beds?

Position/recruiting to the new transition beds were the cause for the spike in vacancies in March, but once these positions are filled it will help with patient flow.

**ED Transition Team:** 



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The ED transition team is in the early stages of development but the NLRHC is establishing a case management team for mental health, including a registered nurse, occupational therapist and a facility-based social worker. This team will work with patients and follow up with community resources. This team will work on extending workdays and will provide weekend supports with community linkages and community resources.

ED mental health RCMP transition to the community. Mental health versus criminal health
PAC team for mental health. System prospective of how to work together for patient. 3-year rapport with the RCMP.
With increasing reliance on community organizations to provide support for rising mental health issues, is there a need for psychiatry services in the city?
The 10-bed unit is full but striving to an 80 per cent occupancy. Jordanna has offered to connect with AHS Mental Health for a
presentation on services available from mental health, to the community.
Can partnering with major companies help bring psychiatry services to the area, and with recruitment for high school and post-secondary enrollment?
RhPAP is always looking to get in front of the student body to get students interested in the North, at all levels. RhPAP works
within a given community to showcase its best features to potential practitioners. It also supports high schools and post- secondary institutions, to attract future practitioners. Anita will bring forward to her team for help and will report back.
