Alberta Health Services	Janice Stewart, Chief Zone Officer, Central Zone, shared the following:	
Zone Update	COVID update in Central Zone.	
	<ul> <li>Nursing staff vacancies and physician coverage continue to be the primary reasons for service disruptions in the Central Zone. While some of the challenges are linked to historical vacancies in areas that have been difficult to recruit to, increased sick time related to the pandemic has exacerbated both staff and physician coverage challenges.</li> <li>Announced by government earlier this year, the Rural Education Supplement and Integrated Doctor Experience (RESIDE) program will provide \$2 million to 20 new family physicians in each of the next three years.</li> <li>Connect Care wave 5 launches will be in May. For more information on implementation timelines visit <u>Connect Care website</u>.</li> <li>Two Hills Health Centre service disruptions to the Emergency Department (ED).</li> <li>Work continues to happen between AHS and the Galahad Care Centre. An announcement will come in the next few months.</li> </ul>

The University of Calgary will provide delivery of the program, with AHS providing classroom space at the Wainwright Health Centre where nursing students will be trained.</li> </ul>

Presentation(s)	<ul> <li>Presentation: Alberta Cancer Screening Programs</li> <li>Monica Schwann - Director, Screening Programs, Provincial Population and Public Health</li> <li>Monica presented to the council on the different newborn and cancer screening programs available, what cancer screening is, and how early detection is important. She shared the principles of screening and the types of screening tests common for different types of cancer. Monica also acknowledged that many barriers may affect one's decision to participate in cancer screening and early detection, and invited attendees to discuss what other barriers may exist in the community. The presentation concluded with questions and answers, and sharing of tools and supports available to clients and families.
