RE:	Changes to Anti Xa test codes in Calgary

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#### **Key Message**

• Effective April 12, 2022, clinician providers/prescribers must select one of four specific Anti Xa tests, choosing the most appropriate drug:

Test Name	Test Mnemonic
Anti Xa Unfractionated Heparin	Xa UFH
Anti Xa LMWH (Low Molecular Weight Heparin)	Xa LMWH
Anti Xa Apixaban	Xa APIX
Anti Xa Rivaroxaban	Xa RIV

Patients not receiving treatment should be defaulted to Anti Xa Unfractionated Heparin (Xa-UFH). The
laboratory will no longer be able to perform Anti Xa testing if a specific drug is not indicated (eg if
testing is requested using a paper requisition, without indicating the specific drug).

## Background

- Anti Xa testing can assist with the acute care/inpatient or intra-/post-operative monitoring of heparinbased therapies. Anti Xa testing is also occasionally used to monitor certain oral anticoagulant medications (ie Apixaban (Brand name: Eliquis) and Rivaroxaban (Brand name: Xarelto), when specifically clinically indicated.
- To facilitate STAT and 24-hour Anti Xa test availability, this testing will move from DSC Special Coagulation and will now be performed at the Foothills Medical Center, Hematology dept.
- Reagents for Anti Xa testing have been developed with specific sensitivity to heparin, LMWH, Apixaban, and Rivaroxaban. Selecting the appropriate drug is essential for accurate reporting of results.

#### How this will impact you

- The current Anti Xa (AFXA) order will no longer be available April 12, 2022.
- Order specific Anti Xa level based on a specified drug:

Anti Xa Unfractionated Heparin Anti Xa LMWH Anti Xa Apixaban Anti Xa Rivaroxaban



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## **Action Required**

- Order appropriate Anti Xa test code based on the appropriate drug.
- Test Directory will be updated to reflect changes for Anti Xa testing.
