RE:	Changes to Labels for CSF Testing in Connect Care

### **Key Message**

Effective December 6, 2021, there will be changes in labelling of specimens for CSF testing in Connect Care.

### **Background**

- This process has been developed to ensure the appropriate tests are performed on the correct CSF specimens based on the order in which the tubes are collected.
- With the current process, the collection order of the CSF specimens may be miscommunicated, potentially causing tests to be performed on the incorrect tube and affecting the test results.

### How this will impact you

- At collection, the CSF labels printed will no longer show the tests ordered. Generic CSF tube labels will be generated with a blank spot to hand write a number on the tube indicating the order of collection.
- If this spot is left blank, the laboratory will assume the numbers etched on the tube represent the order of collection.
- All tubes and any unused labels should be delivered to the lab specimen receiving area.

#### **Action Required**

- Order all required tests on the CSF source as usual.
- Label all the CSF specimens. Ensure the order of collection is indicated by hand writing the numbers on the CSF labels in the spot provided or indicated with the etched numbers on the tubes.
- If there is a discrepancy between the etched number and the number hand written on the label, the written number will be assumed to be correct.
- Document collection in Connect Care.
- Deliver all samples and any unused CSF labels to the lab specimen receiving area.
