•	The advisory council's report was approved by Cabinet in June 2021. Recommendations from the MHAAC's report are providing guidance for implementing a Recovery Oriented System of Addiction and Mental Health in Alberta.	
•	To respond to the MHAAC recommendations a cross-government committee, the Alberta Recovery Council, was established to develop and implement actions to meet the recommendations including an overall shift to recovery-oriented system of care.	
•	Recovery capital is fundamental to the concept of recovery oriented systems of care, and has been described generally as the resources or assets that support an individual's recovery journey. Beyond just stabilization these resources support growth and human flourishing.	
•	MHAAC final report recommendations are aimed at implementing a recovery oriented system of care for AMH. The vision for recovery in Alberta – all Albertans with mental health and addiction concerns and issues to be effectively supported in their personal journeys towards recovery by integrated whole of community ROSC that are easily accessible when needed.	
•	A ROSC checklist will allow ministries to understand how their initiatives align with ROSC and identify where changes are needed to increase recovery alignment.	
•	Early work has also begun on an outcomes reporting framework to support cross-ministry reporting on a common set of outcomes. This will enable us to report on outcomes and successes implementing ROSC.	
•	The members of the council provided their input into the ROSC recommendations and implementation process. Lots of discussion around the use of term recovery. The council would like an opportunity to be invited to the ARC if they are willing to work with PAC.	
•	Looking for an opportunity to brain storm. What can we do to support efforts within our health settings and need to think about strategy from the communications perspective.	
3.2	2 Provincial Addiction & Mental Health Update & Request to PAC PAMH Team	
•	Kerry gave an update on the 90 day review response. AHS has appointment Kerry Bales as the Chief Program Officer, reporting directly to the CEO.	
•	VODP moved from Central Zone and Correctional Health Services in under the leadership of the PAMH.	
•	AHS will work with AH to establish and effective and collaborative planning approach. Commitment to review other AMH programs/supports to determine how AHS will	
	establish standardized approaches to clinical service delivery. AHS working with AH so we have alignment with the policy implementation and how we would establish a service plan in partnership with the zones and Alberta Health. Need to have some consistency for people accessing services no matter where they are in the province. No further structural changes for the AMH, we will make sure all services report through all the leadership in the zones.	
•	We will formalize some plans for implementation process. Have variations across the province and are working with government to make sure we trying to invest and understand across the province towards a common plan.

	3.3 Edmonton Zone update Mark Snaters	e
	<ul> <li>Mark provided an overview of programs and services in the Edmonton Zone for AMH. 300 front line staff. 250 physicians. 120+ programs and services. 50M+ in service contracts. Connect Care is coming to all AHS sites, will be able to see the services available.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>The portfolio will be on one health record by spring of next year. Planning services for Edmonton zones are done in a dyad partnership. AMH Edmonton Zone provides funding to other organizations like CASA and CMHA and have 75 other contracts with the providers in the zone.</li> <li>We have challenges that we recognize in the role. Working on how to improve navigation</li> </ul>	
	for patients and clients.	
	<ul> <li>Most people give up and stop looking for services, it is fragmented, uncoordinated and extremely complex. To improve navigation Edmonton Zone created a community hub opened on September 12.</li> </ul>	
	• A new model of service integration that brings AMH, Home Care, Public Health and the North Edmonton Primary Care Network under the same roof. AMH – access 24/7 relocating and the Hope and Wellness team. It is a remarkable opportunity to do things differently. Also this is on major bus route and lots of free parking.	
	3.4 Patient Family Engagement Karen Binn	s
	<ul> <li>Alberta Health Services is currently working with its patients, families, advisors, and healthcare professionals to create a set of Shared Commitments between patients, their family and staff. These commitments are intended to enhance mutually respectful, satisfying relationships during care. Our goal is to partner with patients, families, advisor and healthcare providers to create a set of shared commitments between patients and providers. The consultation activity session with the members was coordinated in small breakout groups for discussion and members input.</li> <li>Next steps is to analyze and incorporate feedback. Return to steering committee for review. Present to the Senior Leadership in January 2023.</li> </ul>

	• DynaLife is experiencing staffing shortages as well so has resulted in time delays in	
	getting in for things like bloodwork.	
	• With using the My Alberta Health system we should then be able to see improvements	
	later this year. Question came up regarding policy of when a hospital auxiliary does fund	
	raising such as a hospital gift shop to donate eg. a new machine or new bed.	
	<ul> <li>Making sure goals are aligned and partnership is laid out. Having challenge with younger generations not volunteering and donating. To address this a strategy in place to pilot</li> </ul>	
	with the Stollery Childrens Foundation and other foundation partners.
