- Developing a operational and quality dashboard on ICU delirium to facilitate continued quality improvement and learnings.

Benefits to Patients, Family members & Staff:

Benefits include (but not limited to):

- Decrease incidence and duration of ICU delirium
- Improve quality of ICU delirium care across the province with evidenceinformed best practices
- Improve outcomes, patient and family experiences, and family satisfaction with quality of the care we provide
- Collaborate & learn together as a critical care community, and contribute to a larger body of knowledge
- Access to ICU delirium resources
- Reduce ICU length of stay and hospital length of stay

Why address ICU delirium?

delirium was identified as a priority area of focus by Alberta's critical care community consisting of ICU care providers, patient & family advisors, clinical & operational leaders, and researchers.

Critical care patients experiencing delirium are at higher risk for prolonged mechanical ventilation, accidental catheter removal, accidental extubation, the need for physical restraints and greater use of continuous sedation.

There are many underlying causes of delirium that can be prevented. Delirium is complex and if undetected goes untreated, and can have significant long term health implications.
