If you do not have this information, pump therapy may be replaced with multiple daily injections in hospital.
Infusion Sets or PODS (plan for 1-2 sets/day in case of insertion site failure or procedures where the infusion set cannot be worn, etc.)
Extra Tubing if required for specific pumps
Insertion Device if used
Batteries
Alcohol Swabs
Barrier Wipes, Adhesive wipes or Adhesive Remover
Blood Glucose Meter
Blood Glucose Test Strips or Glucose Sensors
Lancing Device and Lancets
Ketone Test Strips (Blood or Urine) check expiry date
Insulin glulisine (Apidra®) is not a stocked insulin in hospital- if you use this insulin you need to bring your own** ** (aspart (NovoRapid®) and lispro (Humalog®) are available in hospital)**
