## Medicine Strategic Clinical Network: Long COVID

## **Background**

The Medicine Strategic Clinical Network™ (MSCN™) Long COVID Working Group was established in February 2021 to support the management of patients with Long COVID by developing strategies and tools to harmonize a provincial approach of clinical services and evaluation for Long COVID, focusing on specialty care and primary-specialty care integration.

## **Key Objectives**

Collaborate with stakeholders to:

- to identify and address gaps in Long COVID knowledge and services;
- co-design supportive strategies/guidelines/tools for the management of patients with Long COVID;
- design, implement, and manage the REDCap database for Long COVID;
- establish provincial data collection and analytic capability to support clinical care, increase understanding of Long COVID condition(s), and provide opportunities for ongoing quality improvement.

## **Project Deliverables**

Since launching this work, the working group has now completed its original mandate. The following deliverables have been achieved:

- Provincial referral guidelines and triage criteria for the management of Long COVID have been developed and implemented, AHS staff can access via Insite.
- Co-developed provincial and zonal pathways (Provincial Adult Long COVID Pathway) resource tools.
- Implemented a common data collection system and standardized metrics, including patient-reported experience measures and patient-reported outcome measures, for the Interprofessional Out-patient (IPOP) Long COVID clinics.
- Developed a provincial evaluation framework for the respiratory-focused Long COVID clinics which can be customized by stakeholders.
- Established the MSCN™ Respiratory COVID Research Collaborative to facilitate a provincial approach to respiratory-focused COVID research.
- The MSCN will now move to focus on providing oversight and support for the provincial data repository and continue to participate in the provincial governance of the AHS Long-COVID response.
