

Patients on Additional IPC Precautions: Movement Outside of the Cell

Assess each patient individually for the following 4Cs

Cognitive: able to follow instructions

Cooperative: willing to follow instructions to wear clean attire and perform hand hygiene

Continent: able to control bladder and bowel discharge

Contained: all drainage and secretions can be contained

If the **4Cs** can be followed, patients can leave their cell for essential purposes*. Exceptions require an AHS Infection Control consult.
