Topic: PPE Safety Coach: Success Story	Discussed implementing the PPE Safety Coach Program at the start of an outbreak and the importance of education and coaching in controlling the outbreak.

	Success of a PPE Safety Coach is influenced by leadership support and training and not individual credentials.
Role Play Scenarios	Key learnings
Participants viewed 2 scenarios and where given the opportunity to discuss and provide feedback and support to each other	As a PPE Safety Coach, mentoring peers or others in leadership roles can at times be challenging, some ways to help guide these conversations could be: to try practice being open, non-judgmental, and recognizing that they may not have had previous education regarding donning and doffing PPE.
