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Discontinuation of Contact and Droplet Precautions for COVID-POSITIVE Patients in Acute Care (regardless of other respiratory virus results)

NOTE:

- For patients who have been or are currently in Critical Care due to COVID-19 infection:
 See Discontinuation of Precautions for Critical Care Patients with Suspected and Confirmed (VRI)
- Duration of COVID-19 isolation in hospital does not depend on immunization status.
- If patient is discharged, default to community guidelines (see COVID-19 Information for Albertans - Prevent the Spread)

Proceed only if patient's symptoms have improved to a new/pre-existing baseline for at least 48 hours.

1.	Have there been 10 days since symptom onset date? Use initial test positive date if patient does not develop symptoms or symptom onset date is not available. □ NO → Maintain Contact and Droplet Precautions until 10 days after patient's symptom onset date □ YES → go to Question 2
2.	Is patient immunocompromised?

COVID-19 Risk Factors

☐ Associated with a COVID-19 outbreak at any healthcare unit/facility or any congregate setting within the last 10 days.
☐ Direction has been given for the patient to remain on Contact and Droplet Precautions or quarantine or self-isolation.
