

Stollery Children's Hospital School offers two types of programs to fit your needs.

School Classroom Program – The child attends school in one of two hospital classrooms (elementary and secondary).

Bedside Teaching Program – If your child is unable to attend the classroom, an Alberta Certified teacher brings individualized learning to their hospital bedside on all patient units, to meet the needs and interests of the student.

Access and Referrals: Families and all members of the Health care and Education teams can refer to the School.

Referrals can be given to the Charge nurse on the Inpatient and Day Units.

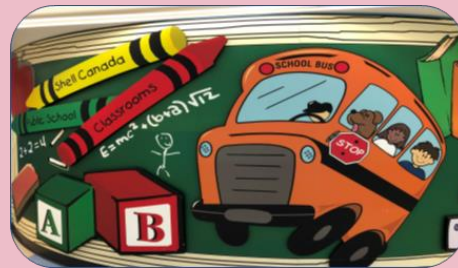
Why Does the Opportunity for School While Hospitalized Matter?

- School, helps youth preserve a sense of identity, feel less dependent, more confident, and helps reduce the loss of normalcy children feel when away from school and classmates.
- We all feel better when we can do familiar, enjoyable activities. Through the Stollery School Programs, youth get a short “break” from hospital life and their illness. This can help make it easier to cope with worries and fears.
- Students transition more easily. Families can avoid difficulties when returning to their community school.

- Hospital teachers help identify any needed academic changes due to illness or injury, for example short-term course load changes, advocating for assistance, proctoring important exams i.e. high school diplomas, and initiating documentation for specialized education, due to illness/injury.

- Work in partnership with parents and encourage advocacy.
