

What is the AMH Research Hub?

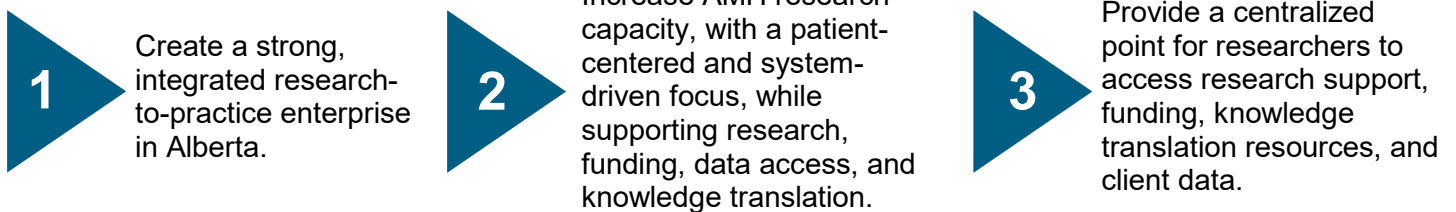
Our vision

Our principles



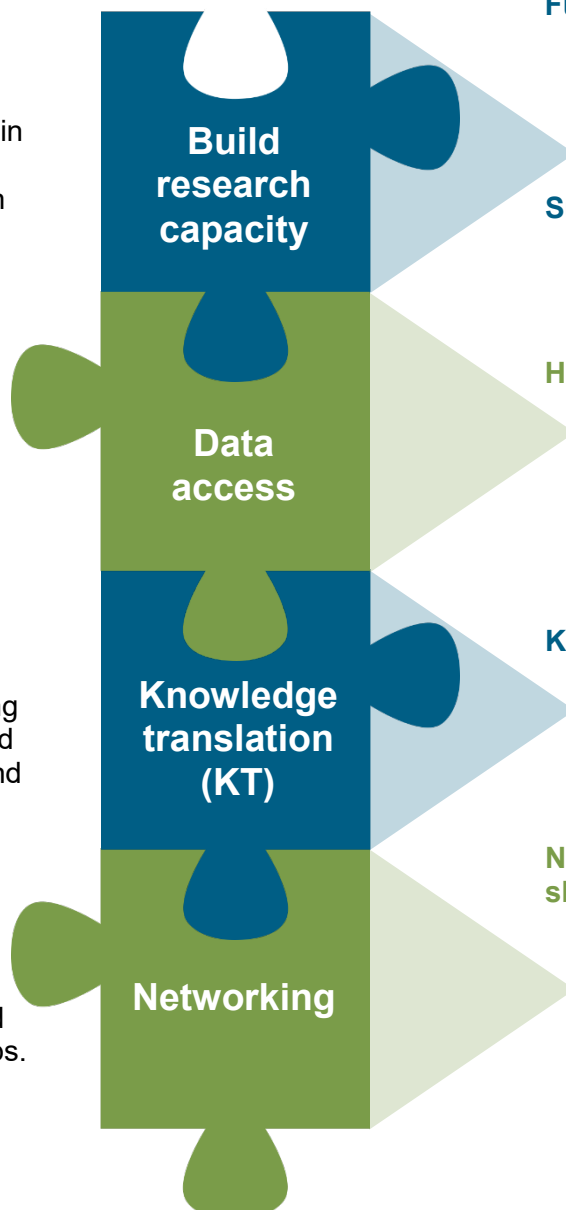
Key functions
