

# Safeworks Monthly Report – September 2023

## Supervised Consumption Services

October 3, 2023

### Background

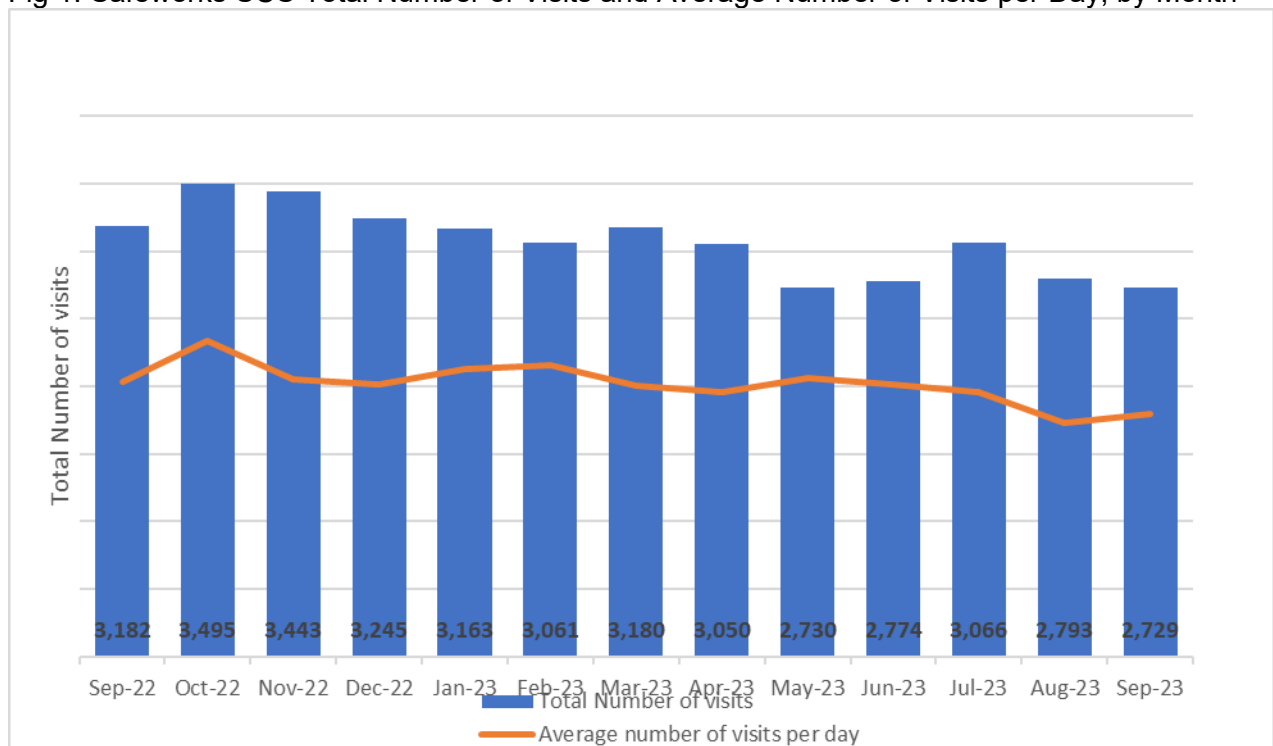
Safeworks Supervised Consumption Services (SCS) launched on October 30, 2017 in a temporary facility at the Sheldon M. Chumir Health Centre with a federal exemption to the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act from Health Canada. On January 15, 2018, the temporary facility closed, and the permanent facility inside the Sheldon M. Chumir Health Centre opened for operations. On April 30, 2018, Safeworks began offering services 24 hours, 7 days a week.

### Service Uptake

From the start of operations on October 30, 2017 to September 30, 2023, Safeworks SCS had **285,609 client visits**. In September 2023, the site saw **469 unique individuals** in **2,729 visits** with an average of 91 visits per day.

Uptake of services declined in the spring of 2020, during the COVID-19 response. Safeworks SCS decreased booth capacity from six booths to three booths on March 19, 2020, following public health recommendations. On July 20, 2020, booth capacity was increased to the full complement of six booths with proper infection control measures in place. Due to the rise in COVID-19 cases in the fall of 2020, booth capacity was again reduced to three on November 10, 2020. On July 21, 2021, booth capacity was once again restored to six booths and continues to operate at that capacity.

## Drug Use and Overdose Prevention and Response

In September 2023, drugs were consumed on site under the supervision of registered nurses (RNs) or paramedics **2,192 times**. With each client who uses drugs by injection, RNs and paramedics are available to provide education on vein care, infection prevention, and injection technique. In September 2023, there was 330 instances of intranasal use (snorting).

The most frequently reported drugs used in September 2023 were methamphetamine (886 times) and fentanyl (735 times).

Overdose response kits (containing Naloxone) and overdose prevention education are offered to all clients accessing Safeworks SCS. In September 2023, SCS staff distributed **244 overdose response kits**.

Since operations began on October 30, 2017 to September 30, 2023, Safeworks staff have responded to a **total of 6,785 overdoses**.

In September 2023, Safeworks staff responded to **158 overdoses**. Of these, 155 required supplemental oxygen, 61 required naloxone and 3 required an EMS response.

## Wrap-Around Care and Referrals

To provide streamlined access to specialized care, Safeworks SCS has partnerships with both AHS programs and external community partners. In September 2023, Safeworks made 108 referrals.
