Provincial Pathways Unit (PPU) delivers seamless, integrated care by standardizing, coordinating, and enabling the co-design and use of clinical, referral and patient pathways.

PPU developed and launched:



New **patient** pathways launched including:

- + Trigger Finger
- + Obstructive Sleep Apnea (OSA)
- + Hepatitis B
- + Male LUTS
- + Ganglion Cyst
- + Gender Affirming Care
- + Mental Health and Kidney Dialysis



New **clinical** pathways launched covered a broad range of clinical areas including:

Alberta's Pathway Hub (The Hub): A centralized solution for pathway access



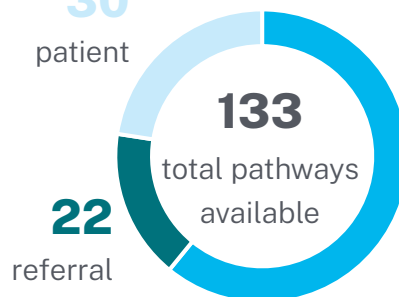
The Hub was accessed
