Free wifi is available. Use network: **healthspot** to get connected.


If you need to charge your devices, there are plug-ins in the waiting spaces on each level and in each patient room.



Parking

P There is underground parking at the cancer centre. Go down Hospital Drive and turn right at the first set of lights. Then use the ramp to your right down to the parkade.

To help you find your vehicle, remember the:

- Floor number where you parked.
- **Colour** (green, blue, or orange) where you parked.
- Colour of the elevator you used.

Parking elevators

Parking elevators **only** take you to the **Lower Courtyard and Main Floor**. If you are going to Floor 2 or higher, you must get off the parking elevator on the main floor and take a **different set** of elevators.

How do I pay for parking?

You can pay **or** add extra time to your parking by using:

- Any pay station machine. These are located in the elevator lobbies or on the Main Floor. Or,
- The free app "AHS Parking" (download from the App Store or Google Play). Zone code is: 6017

Weekly or monthly parking passes are available at the Foothills Medical Centre **Central Parking Office**. Ask your care team for more details.

Finding your way

These resources can help you find your way around the cancer centre:

- Volunteers find them wearing red vests.
- **Site maps** found near the parking elevators on the Main Floor.
- **Directory** found at every elevator.



Checking in

Go to the area listed on your appointment letter. Your treatment appointments may be in a different location from your clinic appointments.

What to bring:

Photo ID and health care card.

- List of your medications.
- Any medications you might need to take during your visit.

Other helpful things to bring:

- Something to do like a book, phone, or tablet.
- Something to eat and drink or money to buy something.
- Your Newly Diagnosed book. If you don't have one, you'll get one at your first appointment.
- List of questions.
- Family member or friend if possible. There is a lot of information at your appointments. It helps to have someone else listen.
- Something to record what is said during your appointment like a notebook or your smartphone with the **My Care Conversations** app.
