What is an Indigenous cancer patient navigator?

Indigenous patient navigators are registered nurses who work with Indigenous peoples impacted by cancer. This service is meant to support patients and families not currently admitted to hospital

What can an Indigenous cancer patient navigator help me with?

Indigenous patient navigators bridge western medicine in cancer care with traditional ways by:

- Finding cultural peoples to help facilitate cultural practices
- Advocating for patients, and helping to answer questions about diagnosis and treatment
- Helping health professionals to better understand Indigenous peoples, and their cultural ways
- Connecting clients to services and resources

How do I access the Indigenous patient navigator?

Call the number listed, or ask a health care provider for a referral.

Services are free and confidential.

Referrals can be made by anyone at any point during the cancer journey.
