## Patient and Family Resource Centre

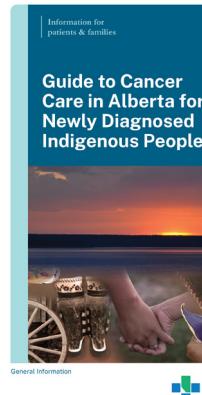
The centre offers information and support resources about the cancer journey including community resources, referrals, and library services. If you are new to CCI, they can also arrange a personalized patient orientation.

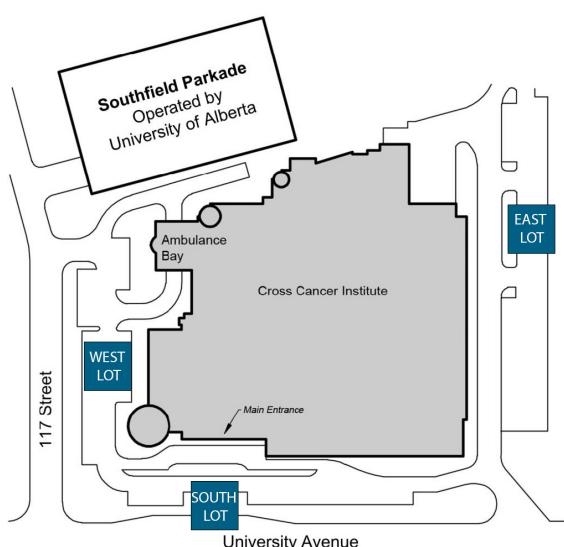

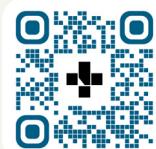

## Drop off and pick up

There are 2 drop off and pick up areas at CCI. The main entrance (south side) and in the Southfield parkade.

## Volunteer drivers

## Parking

**P** Surface lots or underground parking is available. Surface lots are found on the east, west and front side of CCI. The Southfield Parkade is underground. The entrance is located on 117th Street, behind the centre. This parkade is operated by the University of Alberta, not Alberta Health Services. For information on the underground parkade, please call 780-492-7275.

## How do I pay for parking?



For **AHS surface parking**, you can pay or add extra time using:

- Any pay station machine, located at the main entrance
- The free app “**AHS Parking**” (available on the App Store or Google Play)

Weekly and monthly parking passes are available at the **CCI Billing Office**.

For **underground parking**, payment can be made at the pay stations located in the parkade. Underground parking cannot be paid for at any other location.

## Finding your way

Volunteers wearing burgundy vests are available throughout the building to help with wayfinding. If you need a wheelchair during your visit, they are available for your use.

## Staying connected

Free Wi-Fi is available. Use network: **healthspot** to get connected.

If you need to charge your devices, there are plug-ins in the waiting spaces on each level and in each patient room.

## Checking in

Go to the area listed on your appointment letter. Your treatment appointments may be in a different location from your clinic appointments.

## What to bring:

- Photo ID and health care card.
- List of your medications.
- Any medications you might need to take during your visit.

## Other helpful things to bring:

- Something to do like a book, phone, or tablet.
- Something to eat and drink or money to buy something.
- Your Newly Diagnosed book. If you don't have one, you'll get one at your first appointment.
- List of questions.
- Family member or friend if possible. There is a lot of information at your appointments. It helps to have someone else listen.
- Something to record what is said during your appointment like a notebook or your smartphone with the **My Care Conversations** app.
