<i>Qualifications</i>	Candidates must be registered or be eligible for registration with the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada or the College of Family Physicians of Canada, and have current licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta and appointment to the AHS Medical Staff.
<i>Compensation</i>	Remuneration is in accordance with AHS contractor agreements.

Overview

Connect Care Area Trainers (ATs) are users of the Connect Care clinical information system (CIS) in one or more areas of clinical specialization. ATs are trained and supported to instruct and support peers (in their own or similar clinical area or specialty) in safe and acceptable CIS use while promoting transformation and clinical improvement.

Accordingly, they work closely with zone medical leadership and co-report to relevant Associate Chief Medical Information Officers (ACMIOs). It is possible for Physician Design Leads, MILs, other physician roles or physician contributors to extend their Connect Care commitment by adding an AT role for a larger overall FTE allocation.

ATs are guided by CMIO Provincial Training team who have provincial scope and responsibility for design of curriculum content that can be adapted to clinical area and facility needs.

AHS is recruiting for ATs in the following specialty/clinical areas:

- Ambulatory
- Anesthesiology
- Emergency
- Lumens
- Inpatient Admitting (including General Internal Medicine; Medicine Subspecialties; Hospitalists; Family Medicine)
- Pediatrics
- Obstetrics and Gynecology
- Addictions Mental Health
- Surgery (including General Surgery and Surgical subspecialties)



Expectations

Area Trainers should be interested in training their physician colleagues and are excited to positively contribute to the further refinement of physician training.

Getting Trained: (64 hours compulsory)

Area Trainers will receive training specific to their role to develop proficiency with Connect Care and to facilitate productive communications and interactions. Additionally they will participate in teach backs as preparation for training delivery. Training will begin in May 2020.

Delivering Training: (60 hours est)

Area Trainers will train Connect Care Super Users for their roles as well as delivering formal Connect Care training to End User physicians including basic training, personalization & optimization.

Launch Support: (36 hours est)

Area Trainers will have the opportunity to be a key part of launch support due to their extensive knowledge of the system and experience in training colleagues. Launch support will consist of the following:

- Providing implementation support split between scheduled days and ad hoc.
- Designing and deploying just-in-time user support to address issues arising during CIS launch waves.

There will be an opportunity to extend the role to subsequent waves of Connect Care in the zone.

Hours and compensation may differ for Area Trainers who work more or less than the 60 hours Supporting the Training of Others and 36 hours of Launch Support. Flexibility in the role can occur at the discretion of the ACMIO.
