GPOs in Alberta




- Current roles for family physicians in oncology:

 - Running breast cancer supportive care clinic (Calgary)
 - Managing inpatients (Edmonton)

Goals of Alberta GPO Training Program

- Provide formal training for family physicians who are interested in:
 - Being a clinical associate in cancer clinics (urban/community) (i.e. helping supervise chemotherapy)
 - Being involved in supportive care / survivorship clinics
 - Managing oncology inpatients
 - Acting as a family physician with enhanced oncology knowledge in rural communities

Alberta GPO Training Program
