Duration of Precautions for Viral Respiratory Illnesses

Continuing care homes

Use Droplet and Contact precautions during the isolation period. After the isolation period ends encourage residents to use added precautions.¹

Isolation period

- Duration of resident isolation will vary based on clinical presentation.
- Isolate resident with respiratory illness² on <u>Droplet and Contact precautions</u> until:
 - o Symptoms have improved AND
 - Resident is feeling well enough to resume normal activities AND
 - Resident has been fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication.
- Encourage resident to clean hands well and often.

Added precautions after isolation ends

For five days after isolation ends, resident is strongly encouraged to:

- Clean hands well and often.
- Wear a mask in common areas in the facility and in public spaces.
 - o Practice physical distancing or return to room if needing to remove mask, such as during meals.

- Isolate away from others until symptoms improve and fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication.
- Return to normal activities.
- Clean hands well and often.
- Wear a mask in common areas of the facility and in public places.
