Influenza Outbreak

Manage an outbreak in Correctional Centres

All staff share the responsibility for keeping residents safe. Complete the following actions when an influenza outbreak is confirmed. This checklist provides general measures only – always refer to the corresponding section in the <u>Guide for Outbreak Prevention & Control in Provincial Correctional Centres</u> for detailed recommendations. When applicable, follow site-specific protocols.

☐ Medically isolate confirmed and symptomatic residents.	4.1
 Implement IPC recommendations in Figure 1: Place Contact and Droplet precaution signage outside cell / medical isolation space of confirmed and symptomatic residents. Wear recommended PPE (including mask/respirators, gloves, gown and eye protection). Conduct an Infection Prevention and Control Risk Assessment (IPCRA) prior to every resident interaction. Perform hand hygiene and practice respiratory etiquette. 	4.1
