## **Outbreak Prevention Checklist**

## How to prevent an outbreak in supportive living accommodations

This checklist provides general measures to keep residents safe and prevent an outbreak. For more information see the Guide for Outbreak Prevention & Control in Supportive Living Accommodations.

Pr	event the spread of illness (refer to section 1.1 and 1.4)
	Promote immunization of residents, staff/HCW and visitors.
	Follow routine food safety practices.
	Facilitate safe visiting practices.
	Prevent illness spread from staff/HCW by monitoring for symptoms of illness and not attending work when ill.
	Advise staff/HCW who develop symptoms at work to leave the workplace as soon as possible.
	Implement work restrictions for symptomatic staff/HCW.
Us	se routine IPC practices (refer to section 1.2)
	Complete routine environmental cleaning and disinfection using a-wipe twice procedure.
	Use hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette.
	Wear personal protective equipment recommended in the Infection Prevention Control Risk
	Assessment prior to providing resident care.
Isc	plate symptomatic or confirmed residents (refer to section 1.3)
	Monitor to identify newly symptomatic and/or confirmed residents.
	Isolate symptomatic or confirmed residents on additional precautions immediately.
	Post additional precaution signage outside of the isolating resident's room per site policy.
Ide	entify and report respiratory illness and gastrointestinal illness outbreaks (refer to section 2 and 4)
	Determine if residents with respiratory symptoms meet the reporting criteria.
	Determine if residents and staff/HCW with gastrointestinal symptoms meet the reporting criteria.
