### Clean hands hand hygiene pro system healthcare provider list

The purpose of the Clean Hands Hand Hygiene Pro System (Clean Hands System) is to be able to collect information on the hand hygiene compliance of healthcare providers that interact with a patient or patient's environment. This information is then used to plan, implement and evaluate hand hygiene improvement initiatives; therefore, correctly identifying healthcare providers in the Clean Hands System is important.

The Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) Hand Hygiene Program developed a reference list of healthcare providers for users of the Clean Hands System. This reference list outlines the list of healthcare provider groups available in the Clean Hands System and the individual healthcare providers included in each of the groups.

Reviewers can locate the individual healthcare provider on the list and select the appropriate healthcare provider group in the Clean Hands System. Note the list of clinical, clinical support and non-clinical healthcare providers is not all-inclusive.

#### Rationale

Healthcare provider groups and not individual healthcare providers were selected for a number of reasons.

#### Identification of individuals

The privacy of healthcare providers must be maintained unless the employee has given their informed consent for their information to be passed on. The IPC Hand Hygiene Program must be careful in the case of small sample sizes that individuals are not identifiable. Furthermore, the healthcare provider list in its current form ensures that it is manageable to Reviewers and reduces errors in the identification of healthcare providers (e.g., is the person being observed a Health Care Aide, Licensed Practical Nurse, Registered Nurse, etc.).

#### Small sample sizes

Data on hand hygiene compliance will be used for comparison at the provincial and zone level as well as at the program, site, and unit level. When data are used for comparison, it is important to note that a higher number of observations will generate a more reliable and representative hand hygiene compliance. Small sample sizes could result in an inaccurate measure of hand hygiene compliance. Small sample sizes are not reliable as a change in hand hygiene compliance could be due to chance alone rather than the effect of a hand hygiene improvement initiative. Since it is not possible to observe hand hygiene compliance in all areas of the healthcare system at all times a sample is taken to represent the hand hygiene compliance in a particular area over a time period. The larger the sample size, the more the confidence in the results to permit meaningful comparison between areas and between time periods.
