RE: Sexual Assault Healthcare in Central Zone

With the launch of a new provincial Sexual Assault Healthcare Provider Consult Line, we are advising you of the expansion of services provided to Central Zone patients who have been sexually assaulted.

Central Zone physicians now have access to consultation services, provided by the Central Alberta Sexual Assault Response Team (CASART), based in the Red Deer Regional Hospital Centre (RDHRC).

ER physicians and nurses can consult directly with CASART at 403-343-4444.

NEW

CASART will now provide 24/7 phone advice and guidance to rural ER physicians to conduct medical exams, collect forensic evidence and discuss options and wayfinding for patients who have disclosed a sexual assault, at the local ER to which they presented.

EXISTING

CASART can be contacted by any Central Zone ER physician or nurse, to make arrangements for patient transfer to Red Deer Regional Hospital ER, where a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner can provide medical and/or forensic exams to patients who want this service. The CASART team provides service within one hour of being notified of the patient's request for service/consent.

The CASART team provides follow-up for testing and treatment; referrals to supports such as Mental Health and the Central Alberta Child Advocacy Centre; immunizations; Post Exposure Prophylaxis process navigation; and a seamless transition through the healthcare experience for patients and families. In addition, CASART team members may be called upon to provide expert testimony in future legal proceedings.

Depending on the patient's home community, there are also delivery options in Calgary and Edmonton Zones that can be accessed through RAAPID.

Having a variety of options for care is optimal. Care provided by CASART directly at RDRHC ER is an option; however, the virtual support is a valuable alternative when direct care at RDRHC may not be the option of choice for the patient.

Alternatively, the provincial Sexual Assault Healthcare Provider Consult Line can be reached via RAAPID.

Patient Referral

Patient Condition is UNSTABLE

- Patient requires immediate medical interventions.
- Nursing/medical staff treats patient and attempts to preserve evidence, e.g. clothing in paper bag, sanitary pad or tampon in sterile plastic bag or container, avoid wiping/contacting genital area. Label all evidence with patient name and date.
- Once patient is **stable** contact RDRHC ED to connect you to the CASART nurse.

Patient Condition is STABLE

- If patient is requesting RCMP/Police involvement, contact detachment where assault took place. Kit may be collected up to 7 days after assault (or longer if persistent injuries/aggravated assault). If suspected drug-facilitated assault, contact the on-call CASART nurse for
- assistance. ☐ If patient needs to void, advise to avoid
 - wipina. If potential oral contact with assailant within past 24 hours, keep NPO until oral swabs collected if possible.
