New program helps improve access to specialists

The Alberta Facilitated Access to Specialized Treatment (FAST) program allows family doctors and other providers to send referrals for urology or orthopedic surgery to a central team, who can then assign the referral to a specialist with the shortest waitlist.

Referring providers, find out how to use FAST:

- North Zone

- Calgary Zone
- South Zone

The FAST program will expand to all surgical specialties in the upcoming months.

In Ali's honor and memory, this annual service award is presented to one member of the healthcare leadership community in Canada who has demonstrated a passion and commitment for advocating, helping and serving others through volunteerism in their community.

Criteria:

Nominees must hold a position of leadership or influence in the healthcare sector and have made a significant/impactful contribution to the Alberta community and/or across Canada, through extensive volunteer activity to the benefit of deserving charities, other organizations, causes, or individuals.

A CCHL member in good standing must complete the required nomination form and submit to Lesley Myles, Chair of SAC-CCHL at Lesley.myles@shaw.ca no later than April 30, 2023.
