As part of their effort to support the appropriate use of antibiotics, AHS' Antimicrobial Stewardship Program has developed some new resources:

- Antibiotic Resistance What can you do?

- Does your patient truly have a penicillin allergy?
- Hospitalized Pneumonias
- Avoid fluoroquinolones as first-line therapy

The Antimicrobial Stewardship Program encourages healthcare workers to re-examine how these life-saving but limited drugs are being prescribed to ensure we preserve their usefulness.
