A Conversation on AHS Medical Staff Bylaw Proposed Amendments

Our current AHS Medical Staff Bylaws & Rules are in need of a refresh to match updated practice requirements and expectations. Following an extensive review, the AHS Medical Staff Bylaws & Rules Review Committee

(MSBRRC) has drafted an updated and enhanced set of Medical Staff Bylaws & Rules that:

- ensure responsiveness to changes in expectations of patients and AHS medical staff;
- meet needs in the workplace, continuing to support a just culture and focusing on restoration of relationships; and
- support a psychologically safe work environment where our people can do their best work.

The review of the AHS Medical Staff Bylaws and Rules took place over the last four years, and was led jointly by the Zone Medical Staff Associations (ZMSAs) and AHS Medical Leaders in the form of the MSBRRC. External legal counsel has also been engaged, including consultation with the Canadian Medical Protective Association (CMPA), who contributed important suggestions and content. By formal resolution, the committee is now recommending a set of amended Bylaws and Rules to reflect current practice requirements and expectations.

I want to thank everyone for their hard work in reviewing these, and encourage all AHS Medical Staff to visit the <u>AHS Medical Staff Bylaws and Rules webpage</u> to access the different resources and information sessions available to learn more.

Provincial Enterprise Imaging replacing IMPAX

Provincial Enterprise Imaging (PEI) is replacing IMPAX as the new Picture Archiving & Communication System (PACS). Central Zone's implementation has been rescheduled for Tues., Jan. 28, 2025, following an initial delay due to technical issues. AHS and our vendor Agfa have determined the root cause and are confident the issues are resolved, and the updated system will significantly enhance user experience.

Edmonton Zone is implementation is scheduled for Mar. 4, 2025, and Calgary and South Zone will implement by May 2025.

After PEI implementation, medical staff will view diagnostic images and reports using the XERO viewer in Connect Care. Refer to <u>XERO Viewer tip</u> sheet and <u>Workflow Reminder</u>. Also, with PEI implementation, <u>OrthoView</u> will replace MediCAD.

Training is required to access PEI. Before implementation, staff who need PEI access will be invited to complete training through MyLearningLink. If you need access to PEI and have not received a training invitation four weeks before implementation in your zone, email

Effective now, the <u>Collection of Patient Allergy and Adverse Reaction</u> <u>Information Policy</u> provides a consistent approach for collecting and documenting patient allergy and adverse reactions.

Highlights:

- Review and document at first point of entry and before patient care
- The health record is the shared source of information
- Connect Care patient ID wristbands replace coloured allergy wristbands, which must no longer be used
