# Donation after Cardiocirculatory Death (DCD) policy revised to include MAiD

The scheduled revision of the <u>Donation After Cardiocirculatory Death (DCD)</u> <u>Policy (HCS-243)</u> is complete. Effective Feb. 4, 2025, this policy includes direction regarding DCD following the provision of Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) and minor rephrasing of some content for greater clarity. The objective is to enhance communication between the MAiD patient, alternate decision-maker(s), families and healthcare providers, with an emphasis on patient dignity and family support.

### Learn how to identify patient safety issues

There are common patient safety concerns that can be found within healthcare systems. These issues are routinely identified through the analysis of national and international data by organizations such as the <u>ECRI</u> Institute and the Canadian Institute for Health Information.

The Calgary Zone Integrated Quality Management team created a methodology to determine the top patient safety issues reported by staff and physicians in your zone, site, or program. The full report can be seen on Insite.
