Provincial Enterprise Imaging (PEI) implementation in the Central Zone has revealed new issues in the PEI system. Our vendor, Agfa, is working diligently with AHS to find the root cause of these issues and a solution. Therefore, to ensure patient safety and support clinical workflows, we have opted to delay the planned implementation of PEI in Edmonton Zone originally scheduled for March 4, 2025. We will advise through this channel once a new implementation date has been established.
