Available March 20: Connect Care Ambulatory Medication Information in Netcare

A new display for Connect Care Outpatient Med Orders will be available in Netcare, and will include the following:

- Data will be updated in real time.
- Data will not be available via Pharmaceutical Information Network (PIN), but as a separate tab in the medication section of Netcare.
- Medications listed will be based on medication orders. This means they will be prescribed for administration, but not necessarily dispensed or administered, which is different than information in PIN which is based on dispensed medications.

American Academy of Neurology President's Award Winner

Dr. Janis Miyasaki is being honored with the American Academy of Neurology (AAN) 2025 President's Award. The award honors outstanding service to the AAN and to the profession of neurology.

Dr. Miyasaki is Department Head of Clinical Neurosciences at the University of Alberta and Alberta Health Services, where she was the Department of Medicine's first Director of Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion.

Some of her other roles include a longtime member of the AAN Board of Directors; director of education for neurology for four hospitals; president of the Medical Staff Association; and president of the Canadian Movement Disorders Group. Dr. Miyasaki is also an active clinical researcher and mentor in movement disorders, physician wellness, and equity.
