Don't get measles. Get immunized.

On Monday, the province announced a new measles hotline through Health Link 811. The hotline, reached at 1-844-944-3434, is one of several steps that the health system and government are together taking to address the growing number of measles cases in Alberta.

We thank all staff and providers who continue to work diligently to immunize, identify and reduce risk of measles across Alberta. We also encourage all providers and staff to get immunized. Stay up to date by visiting ahs.ca/measles and alberta.ca/measles.

Hazardous medication identification alert available in Connect Care

On May 5, the hazardous medication identification alert (Phase 1) was integrated into Connect Care. Phase 1 includes non-ambulatory patients (e.g., inpatient, emergency room encounters, surgical procedures).

This alert was created due to numerous requests asking that patients receiving hazardous medications be identified in Connect Care, outside of the medication administration record. For further information, review the Care Support Forum posted May 1.

Phase 2 will expand identification of hazardous medications to ambulatory and community patients, with implementation planned for a future date.
