Recent changes to Connect Care file access

A recent update has changed how Insite files are accessed from Connect Care. If a user opens an Insite file from within Connect Care, they are now prompted to sign in with their work credentials through a Microsoft Sign-In page.

Insite files were recently migrated to SharePoint Online as part of the <u>Microsoft Technologies Program</u>, which required that all file storage migrate to Microsoft cloud storage to ensure integration and accessibility by all users.

Connect Care credentials do not flow through SharePoint Online, which is why users are now prompted with the Microsoft Sign-In page when opening an Insite file.

We recognize this change has caused frustration. Addressing this issue is a high priority and we are exploring every avenue to try and resolve. We appreciate your patience.
