Hospital-based leadership pilot sites; regional corridor structure

On Thursday, AHS sent out an <u>email</u> with an update on the implementation of hospital-based leadership (HBL), which ensures the people closest to care delivery have the authority and support to make timely, effective decisions.

In summary, 10 sites from across the province will begin the launch of HBL as pilot sites in January 2026. These sites reflect the diversity of AHS, with a mix of large urban hospitals, regional referral centres, and diverse rural facilities.

The pilot sites are:

- 1. Rockyview General Hospital (Calgary)
- 2. Medicine Hat Regional Hospital
- 3. Northern Lights Regional Health Centre (Fort McMurray)
- 4. University of Alberta Hospital (Edmonton)
- 5. Cardston Health Centre
- 6. Fox Creek Healthcare Centre
- 7. Ponoka Hospital and Care Centre
- 8. Rocky Mountain House Health Centre
- 9. Brooks Health Centre
- 10. Wetaskiwin Hospital and Care Centre

A provincial HBL Pilot Working Council is being stood up and will include pilot site leads as well as representation from medical leadership and other sites across the province. This group will be co-designing elements of this model and will help us identify needs and gaps, to make informed adjustments before a full rollout in Fall 2026.

Regional corridor structure

Effective Dec. 1, zone teams transitioned to a corridor structure to better reflect how Albertans access care and to align with the <u>Government of Alberta's</u> health system planning. Under this new structure, sites will report up to a Corridor Lead. Further information on corridor leads will be shared soon. Patients will access care the same way, with management of patient flow based on care needs and available capacity.

We'll keep you updated as this work continues.

Highlights of revised policy on job shadowing

Alberta Health Services' <u>Job Shadowing</u> Policy has been updated to enhance clarity and consistency. It came into effect on Nov. 13 and applies to all AHS medical staff.

In addition to updated definitions, key changes include:

- Guidance on recommended immunizations: managers must advise individuals requesting to job shadow in an AHS setting that it is recommended they are immunized for vaccine-preventable diseases, including but not limited to chicken pox, hepatitis B, influenza, measles, mumps, rubella, polio, tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis. Further proof of immunizations/immunity may be requested based on unit-specific requirements.
- Clarity around criminal record checks: managers must notify
 individuals requesting to job shadow that a satisfactory criminal record
 check dated no more than 90 days is required, at their cost, prior to
 start of their observational experience when they are requesting an
 experience of more than five working days (38.75 hours).
- Additional job shadowing types were added, and now include observation, hands-on shadowing, regular briefings and tour requests for groups.

Review the new policy on access for religious care providers

The new <u>Community Spiritual and Religious Care Providers Access Policy</u> supports patient access to spiritual and religious care providers which is essential at end of life and other critical phases of the health journey, including during an outbreak or emergency/disaster.

The policy outlines the process by which patients consent to be supported by a religious community visitor, direction on printing the patient religion list, and guidance regarding use of spiritual space.

Advance care planning monthly tip: MyChart & ACP documents

Many Albertans use MyChart to access and upload their health information to Connect Care. Patients can upload decision-making and advance care planning (ACP) documents to their MyChart for review and verification.

At their next healthcare visit, in a Connect Care facility, uploaded ACP documentation needs to be reconciled by a healthcare professional. Check out this month's tip sheet, available on the provincial ACP/GVD Insite page.
