



Context

AHS emphasizes learning and reporting to enhance safe care for patients and healthy work environments for staff and medical staff. While we will never prevent all mistakes from happening, when hazards, close calls, and adverse events are identified through the RLS we are able to initiate efforts to support continuous quality and safety improvement. This contributes to establishing a Just Culture where everyone feels safe, encouraged, and empowered to discuss quality and safety concerns.

How to Submit a Report

Reporting clinical adverse events, close calls, and hazards online involves accessing RLS, choosing the applicable form, and filling it out.

RLS Use

RLS data is protected under Section 9 of the Alberta Evidence Act based on reporter selection or when part of a Quality Assurance Review. Use for safety and quality improvement as part of your role within AHS and behind the AHS firewall is appropriate. Any use outside of AHS, e.g. research, cross organization sharing, presenting at conferences, publishing, etc., requires consultation and approval by Patient Safety Reporting & Analysis.

Please note RLS data is collected by voluntary submission and as such cannot be used to determine incidence and prevalence as there is no denominator available to make such calculations.
