










# OPIOID POISONING SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

**Call 911 if one or more signs are present.**

 <p><b>Slow or No Breathing</b></p>	 <p><b>Unresponsive (Can't Wake Them)</b></p>	 <p><b>Stiff body or seizure-like movement</b></p>
 <p><b>Choking or Throwing Up</b></p>	 <p><b>Gurgling or Snoring Sounds</b></p>	 <p><b>Blue Lips or Nails</b></p>
 <p><b>Narrow (Constricted) Pupils</b></p>	 <p><b>Pale Face</b></p>	 <p><b>Cold and Damp Skin</b></p>

**Avoid using alone and carry naloxone.**
