Assisting people who have needle phobia or live with development challenges to receive the COVID-19 vaccine

Immunization against COVID-19 is very important, and we understand that some people may have needle fears or live with development challenges that make it more challenging to receive the vaccine.

There are supports available to help reduce pain and distress associated with immunization, and improve the comfort and overall experience of those who have needle phobia or live with development challenges that may interfere with them being immunized against COVID-19.

- It is recommended to please speak with your primary care provider first about your concerns. Primary care providers often deliver life-long care to patients and have access to strategies or previous, successful, procedural experiences that may be best suited to fit a person's unique care needs.
- Ask your care provider about AHS' Commitment to Comfort program or visit
 <u>ahs.ca/vaccinecomfort</u> for more information. Commitment to Comfort provides
 resources to help make a person's immunization experience more comfortable, including
 distraction techniques and how to access and use numbing cream.
- Access a specialized AHS COVID-19 Low Stimulus immunization clinic, which is a
 service for people with behavioral or special needs who require a quieter, less
 stimulating environment, or speak with your local AHS Public Health department about
 how they may be able to accommodate your needs. Please have the following
 information ready, prior to inquiring:

 - Name of support person
 - · Phone number
 - Reason vaccine needed in low-stimulus setting

 Services office to discuss how they can accommodate your specialized needs at

- South Zone: Contact your local AHS Public Health or Community Health
 Services office to discuss how they can accommodate your specialized needs at your immunization appointment. Visit ahs.ca for contact information.

Depending on a person's complex needs and care plan, there may be other supports available to help them receive their COVID-19 immunization, such as anaesthesia support. This includes family physicians working with other healthcare professionals, including dentists, to coordinate immunization during a pre-planned operative procedure.
