

COVID-19 Continuing Care Daily Checklist for Visitors
Overview

This tool was developed to support continuing care sites and reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19. **Visitors** are required to complete this checklist before entering the continuing care site. Children may need a parent or guardian to assist them to complete this screening tool.

Any person who is a confirmed case of COVID-19, or has been tested for COVID-19 and is awaiting the results, must not enter the site and must follow isolation requirements as per [CMOH Order 02-2022](#).

Screening Questions:

1.	Have you traveled outside Canada in the last 14 days <u>AND</u> have you been directed to quarantine?	YES	NO
<p>If you answered “YES”:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Do not enter the site unless you have been authorized for an exemption from quarantine. <p>If you have travelled but are unsure about your quarantine requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Follow the Government of Canada Travel, Testing, Quarantine and Borders instructions including any requirements for exempt travelers related to attending high-risk environments. Proceed to question 2. <p>If you answered “NO”, proceed to question 2.</p>			
2.	<p>Have you had any known close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the last 14 days?</p> <p>Close Contact: Means a person who, without the consistent and appropriate use of personal protective equipment, provides care to, lives with, or has close physical contact with, a person who is a confirmed case of COVID-19; or has come into contact with the infectious body fluids of a person who is a confirmed case of COVID-19.</p> <p>Confirmed Case - means a person who has had a positive result on a COVID-19 test that confirms the person is infected with COVID-19. Tests can be rapid antigen tests or lab-based PCR tests.</p>	YES	NO
<p>If you answered “YES”:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Do not enter the site for 14 days since the day of last exposure regardless of your immunization status. Contact the site/service area to arrange alternate visitation as needed. <p>If you answered “NO”, proceed to question 3.</p>			



3.	Do you have any new onset (or worsening) of the following symptoms:	YES*	NO
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fever • Cough • Shortness of breath • Runny nose • Sore throat • Chills • Painful swallowing • Nasal congestion • Feeling unwell / fatigued • Nausea / vomiting / diarrhea • Unexplained loss of appetite • Loss of sense of taste or smell • Muscle / joint aches • Headache • Conjunctivitis (commonly known as pink eye) 			
<p>*Note:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If you are fully immunized¹ and tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 5 days, answer “YES” to this question. If you are NOT fully immunized¹ and tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 10 days, answer “YES” to this question. 			
<p>If you answered “YES” to question 3:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stay home or return home. Do not enter the site. • Use the AHS Online Assessment Tool or call Health Link 811 to receive additional information on testing and isolation. • Individuals with fever, cough, shortness of breath, runny nose, sore throat or loss of sense of taste or smell are required to isolate for 5 days if they are fully immunized¹ and if they are NOT fully immunized¹, they are required to isolate for 10 days as per the current CMOH Order OR receive a negative COVID-19 test and feel better before returning to activities, as long as they have no known exposure. • If your child is experiencing any symptoms from the list above, do not bring them to visit the facility for 10 days from when symptoms started or until symptoms resolve (whichever is longer), unless they receive a negative COVID-19 test result and feel better. <p>If you answered “NO”:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You may enter the site. 			

¹ A fully immunized person who has received the complete vaccine series for COVID-19 and it has been 14 days after the second dose in a two dose series or one dose in a one dose series (e.g. Janssen). If you do not meet this criteria, you are considered NOT fully immunized.
