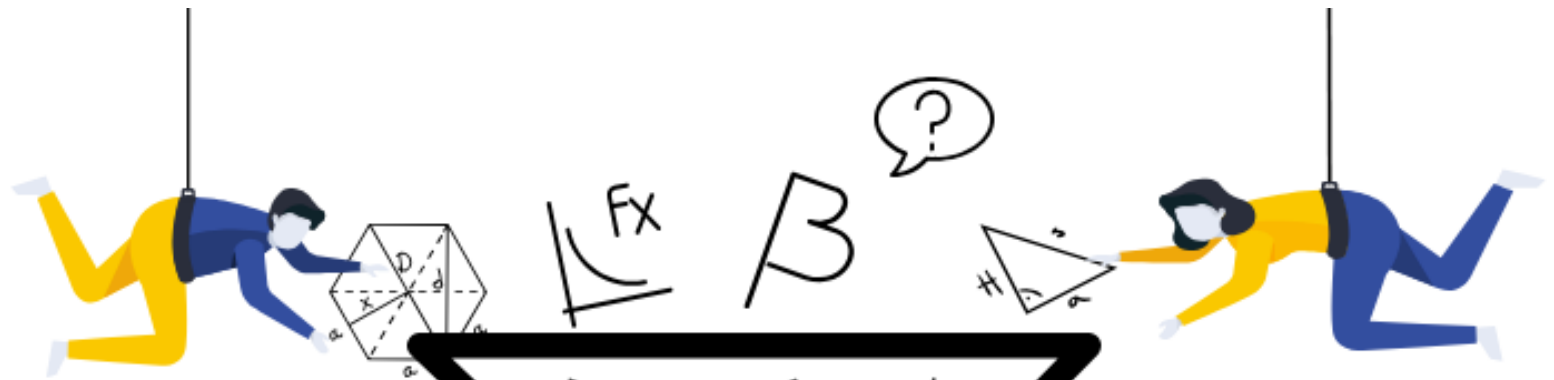

Med Rec

- Use Foley Catheters only when necessary
- Frequent toileting
- Proper hydration
- No incontinence briefs



UTI

- Twice daily oral care
- Frequent mobilization



Pneumonia

- Early identification of signs and symptoms
- Early intervention



Sepsis

- Proper Personal protective equipment
- Proper Hand hygiene
- Antibiotic usage review when appropriate

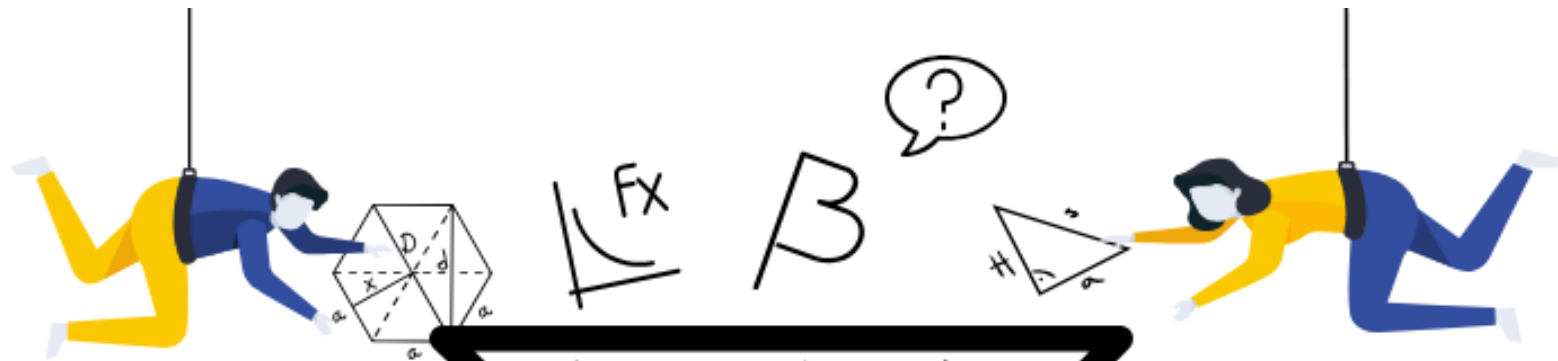

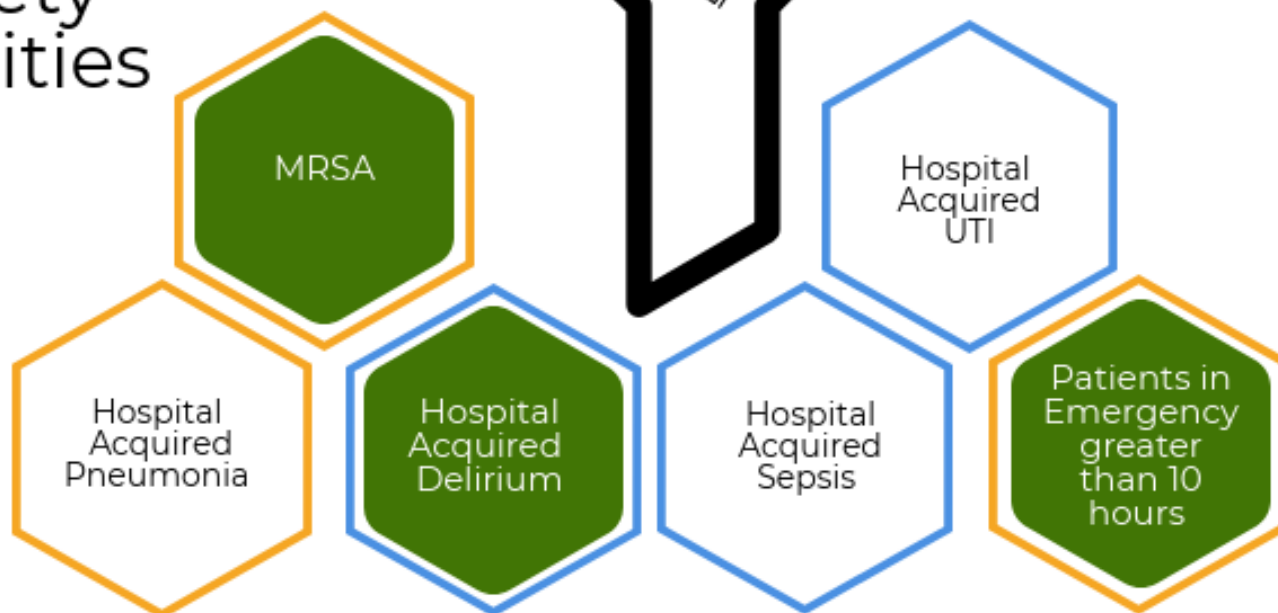

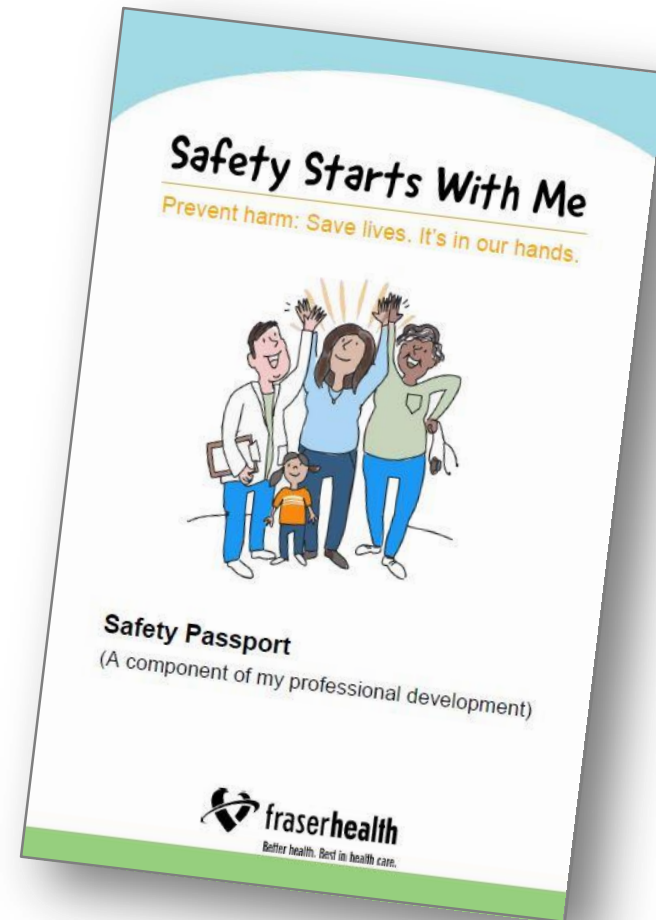
