- People seeking rehabilitation services for medical conditions or trauma often experience changes to their sexual health that significantly impact their quality of life.
- Comprehensive rehabilitation includes addressing this often neglected but fundamental aspect of health and well-being using an inclusive, respectful, positive, interdisciplinary approach.

- The Sexual Health Service is a confidential service that provides education and counseling to people who have had their sexual health impacted by injury, illness or disability.
- Services are available to people of any age, sexual orientation or relationship status, as well as family members/caregivers.

Why access Sexual Health Service?

Any person or family member who has concerns or questions about sexuality and disability may contact the service. Some of the common questions and concerns that people have are:

For Parents...

- How can I talk to my child with special needs about life changes (i.e. coping with puberty)?
- What would my child's sexual maturity look like?

For Youth...

- How do I get someone I like to see past my disability?
- How do I talk to my parents about my sexuality?
- Can I have children?



For Adults/Older Adults...

- How can I have physical closeness with another person?
- Is it safe for me to have sex?
- What are my options to be sexually active?

- Education and information to individuals, families, partners, caregivers and professionals
- Assessment and treatment of sexual health concerns
- Referral* to a wheelchair accessible clinic for:
 - Gynecological health concerns.
 - Complex erectile dysfunction management.

Individuals are seen by one or more interdisciplinary team members including Nurse, Occupational Therapist, Social Worker, Psychologist, Urologist and Gynecologist.

*Referrals to the Urologist/Gynecologist must be made by a Sexual Health Service team member.
