

ORDER OF AN EXECUTIVE OFFICER

RE: Those premises located in Calgary, Alberta and municipally described as:
Valedine
2001 Centre Street N

WHEREAS I, an **Executive Officer of Alberta Health Services**, have inspected the above noted premises pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Act, RSA 2000, c. P-37, as amended;

AND WHEREAS such inspection on March 15, 2021 disclosed that the following conditions exist in and about the above noted premises in contravention of the Public Health Act and which are or may become injurious or dangerous to the public health or which might hinder in any manner the prevention or suppression of disease, namely:

- a. Mouse droppings were observed in the basement rooms and main floor washrooms.
- b. There were no staff or management onsite with valid food safety certification.
- c. There was a buildup of grease, dirt, and debris along the perimeters of the walls and floors and in hard-to-reach places throughout the food establishment.

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following breaches of the Public Health Act and the Food Regulation, Alberta Regulation 31/2006 and the Food Retail and Foodservices Code exist in and about the above noted premises, namely:

- a. Mouse droppings were observed in the basement rooms and main floor washrooms. This is in violation of section 21(1) of the Food Regulation, AR 31/2006 which states that: The commercial food establishment and any surrounding area, premises or facilities supporting the commercial food establishment must be kept free of pests and of conditions that lead to the harbouring or breeding of pests.
- b. There were no staff or management onsite with valid food safety certification. This is in violation of section 31(1) of the Food Regulation, AR 31/2006 which states that: A person operating a commercial food establishment must, at any time when there are 5 or fewer food handlers working on the premises, ensure that at least one individual who has care and control of the commercial food establishment holds a certificate issued by the Minister confirming that individual’s successful completion of a food sanitation and hygiene training program or a document that the Minister considers equivalent to such a certificate.
- c. There was a buildup of grease, dirt, and debris along the perimeters of the walls and floors and in hard-to-reach places throughout the food establishment. This is in violation of section 28(3) of the Food Regulation, AR 31/2006 which states that: All equipment and

utensils in a commercial food establishment must be (a) kept in good working order and condition, and (b) maintained in a manner that ensures the safe and sanitary handling of food.

NOW THEREFORE, I hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT**:

1. That the Owner immediately undertake and diligently pursue the completion of the following work in and about the above noted premises, namely:
 - a. Eliminate the mouse infestation. Remove all mouse droppings. Clean and disinfect all hard surfaces: floors, walls, shelves contaminated by mice or mouse excrement. Ensure a professional pest control company is frequently monitoring the food establishment for pest activity. Provide reports from the pest control company to an Alberta Health Services Executive Officer with details of treatments applied and levels of rodent activity.
 - b. The owner or the chef must obtain an approved food safety certificate.
 - c. Thoroughly clean all surfaces throughout the food establishment, ensure hard to reach areas between and underneath equipment re adequately cleaned.
2. The work referred to in paragraph 1 shall be completed by **March 29, 2021**.

The above conditions were noted at the time of inspection on March 15, 2021 and may not necessarily reflect all deficiencies. You are advised that further work may be required to ensure full compliance with the Public Health Act and regulations, or to prevent a public health nuisance.
