

ORDER OF AN EXECUTIVE OFFICER NOTICE OF CLOSURE

RE: The food establishment located in Rocky View County, Alberta and municipally described as:
Floyd's Lechon Cebu
283200 Meadow Ridge Drive

WHEREAS I, an **Executive Officer** of **Alberta Health Services**, have inspected the above noted premises pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Act, RSA 2000, c. P-37, as amended;

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following conditions exist in and about the above noted premises which are or may become injurious or dangerous to the public health or which might hinder in any manner the prevention or suppression of disease, namely:

- a. Approximately 115 whole pigs were identified being handled, cooked, and stored onsite in various stages of processing. The only means of refrigeration available onsite was a small domestic refrigerator. Pigs in the processing area were measured at temperatures of 10-15 degrees Celsius.
- b. Handwashing supplies were not present in the area used for food preparation. A handwashing sink was not accessible from the area being used to cook whole pigs.
- c. A live dog was present in the area used to prepare whole pigs.
- d. Prepared pigs were stacked against an unfinished wall.
- e. Tables used as food preparation surfaces were damaged or in an otherwise uncleanable state. Prepared pigs were being placed directly on these tables for processing.

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following breaches of the Public Health Act and the Food Regulation, Alberta Regulation 31/2006 and the Food Retail and Foodservices Code exist in and about the above noted premises, namely:

- a. These premises are operating without a valid food handling permit from Alberta Health Services. This is in contravention of Section 3 of the Food Regulation, which states: "No person shall operate a food establishment unless the person is an operator who holds a valid and subsisting permit for the operation of the food establishment, and the food

establishment is identified on the permit as approved by the regional health authority that issued the permit”.

- b. Approximately 115 whole pigs were identified being handled, cooked, and stored onsite in various stages of processing. The only means of refrigeration available onsite was a small domestic refrigerator. Pigs in the processing area were measured at temperatures of 10-15 degrees Celsius. This is in contravention of Section 25(1) of the Food Regulation, which states: “All high-risk food must be stored, displayed and transported at a temperature of not more than 4°C or such higher temperature, or not less than 60°C or such lower temperature”.
- c. Handwashing supplies were not present in the area used for food preparation. A handwashing sink was not accessible from the area being used to cook whole pigs. This is in contravention of Section 30(1) of the Food Regulation, which states: “A food handler must wash hands as often as necessary to prevent the contamination of food or food areas”.
- d. A live dog was present in the area used to prepare whole pigs. This is in contravention of Section 32(2) of the Food Regulation, which states: “A live animal must not be permitted to enter or remain in a commercial food establishment”.
- e. Prepared pigs were stacked against an unfinished wall. This is in contravention of Section 23(1) of the Food Regulation, which states: “All food used or to be used in a commercial food establishment must be protected from contamination, and handled in a sanitary manner”.
- f. Tables used as food preparation surfaces were damaged or in an otherwise uncleanable state. Prepared pigs were being placed directly on these tables for processing. This is in contravention of Section 17(b) of the Food Regulation, which states: “An operator must ensure that, before operation of the commercial food establishment commences, the commercial food establishment is designed so as to facilitate the effective cleaning and sanitizing of it and of all equipment, utensils and surfaces with which food comes into contact in it”.

AND WHEREAS, by virtue of the foregoing, the above noted premises are hereby declared to be **Closed**.

NOW THEREFORE, I hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT**:

- 1. That the Owner immediately close the above noted premises and cease all unapproved commercial food handling operations onsite.
- 2. That the Owner immediately undertake and diligently pursue the completion of the following work in and about the above noted premises, namely:
 - a. All pigs identified as seized onsite must be disposed of in a manner agreed upon and confirmed by an Executive Officer of Alberta Health Services.

- b. Obtain a valid food handling permit from Alberta Health Services prior to commencing any future commercial food handling operations.
- 3. That, until such time as the work referred to in paragraph 2 is completed to the satisfaction of an Executive Officer of Alberta Health Services, the above noted premises shall remain closed.

The above conditions were noted at the time of inspection and may not necessarily reflect all deficiencies. You are advised that further work may be required to ensure full compliance with the Public Health Act and regulations, or to prevent a public health nuisance.
