

ORDER OF AN EXECUTIVE OFFICER

RE: The food establishment located in Calgary, Alberta and municipally described as:
JJ's Neighbourhood Pub
2 Spruce Center SW

WHEREAS I, an **Executive Officer** of **Alberta Health Services**, have inspected the above noted premises pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Act, RSA 2000, c. P-37, as amended;

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following conditions exist in and about the above noted premises which are or may become injurious or dangerous to the public health or which might hinder in any manner the prevention or suppression of disease, namely:

- a. There was uncovered food in the walk-in cooler.
- b. A recent pest control record was not available.
- c. There was a gap at the bottom left side of the back exterior screen door.
- d. Duct tape was used to keep the broken the chest freezer lid together.
- e. There was a significant hole in the storage room ceiling.
- f. There was a buildup of dirt, dust, grease and debris on multiple surfaces in the kitchen, including but not limited to grease deposits and dust buildup on the ventilation canopy plumbing line, and the space under the ventilation canopy; underneath and behind the dishwasher and 2-compartment sink; food debris between the food preparation cooler near the dishwashing area and the standing freezer at the kitchen door; debris on the interior surfaces of the high-temperature dishwasher; accumulated food debris on the lids of bulk food containers; dust buildup on the compressor fan covers in the walk-in cooler.
- g. The area beneath the food preparation table and pizza oven adjacent to the back exterior door was dirty and disorganized. The mechanical room was disorganized, and surfaces were dirty.
- h. There were no written sanitation procedures in place.

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following breaches of the Public Health Act and the Food Regulation, Alberta Regulation 31/2006 and the Food Retail and Foodservices Code exist in and about the above noted premises, namely:

- a. There was uncovered food in the walk-in cooler. This is in contravention of the Food Regulation AR 31/2006 section 23(2), which states that: All food used or to be used in a

commercial food establishment must be protected from contamination, and handled in a sanitary manner.

- b. A recent pest control record was not available. This is in contravention of the Food Regulation AR 31/2006 section 21(2), which states that: A written record of all pest control measures used in the commercial food establishment and surrounding area, premises and facilities referred to in subsections (1) and (1.1) must be maintained.
- c. There was a gap at the bottom left side of the back exterior screen door. This is in contravention of the Food Regulation AR 31/2006 section 17(2), which states that: the operator must ensure that the commercial food establishment is constructed to control the entry of pests.
- d. Duct tape was used to keep the broken the chest freezer lid together. This is in contravention of the Food Regulation AR 31/2006 section 28(3), which states that: all equipment and utensils in a commercial food establishment must be kept in good working order and condition, and maintained in a manner that ensures the safe and sanitary handling of food.
- e. There was a significant hole in the storage room ceiling. This is in contravention of the Food Regulation AR 31/2006 section 17(1), which states that: an operator must ensure that, before operation of the commercial food establishment commences, the commercial food establishment is of sound construction and in a good state of repair,
- f. There was a buildup of dirt, dust, grease and debris on multiple surfaces in the kitchen, including but not limited to grease deposits and dust buildup on the ventilation canopy plumbing line, and the space under the ventilation canopy; underneath and behind the dishwasher and 2-compartment sink; food debris between the food preparation cooler near the dishwashing area and the standing freezer at the kitchen door; debris on the interior surfaces of the high-temperature dishwasher; accumulated food debris on the lids of bulk food containers; dust buildup on the compressor fan covers in the walk-in cooler. This is in contravention of the Food Regulation AR 31/2006 section 28(2), which states that: A commercial food establishment, all equipment and utensils in it and all surfaces in it with which food comes into contact must be maintained in a sanitary condition and, without limiting the foregoing, must be washed and sanitized in a manner that removes contamination.
- g. The area beneath the food preparation table and pizza oven adjacent to the back exterior door was dirty and disorganized. The mechanical room was disorganized, and surfaces were dirty. This is in contravention of the Food Regulation AR 31/2006 section 28(2), which states that: A commercial food establishment, all equipment and utensils in it and all surfaces in it with which food comes into contact must be maintained in a sanitary condition and, without limiting the foregoing, must be washed and sanitized in a manner that removes contamination.
- h. There were no written sanitation procedures in place. This is in contravention of the Food Regulation AR 31/2006 section 28(2), which states that: A commercial food establishment must have written procedures designed to ensure its safe and sanitary operation and maintenance.

NOW THEREFORE, I hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT**:

1. That the Owner immediately undertake and diligently pursue the completion of the following work in and about the above noted premises, namely:

- a. Properly cover foods stored in the walk-in cooler.
- b. Implement an integrated pest control program for the exterior and interior of the food establishment. Provide a copy of the monitoring reports to an Alberta Health Services, Public Health Inspector for review.
- c. Repair the screen door to prevent the entry of pests.
- d. Repair or replace the chest freezer.
- e. Properly close the hole in the storage room ceiling. Ensure the finished surface is smooth and washable.
- f. Thoroughly clean and sanitize the entire kitchen including all hard-to-reach areas in the kitchen.
- g. Prepare, implement, and maintain a detailed written daily/ weekly/ monthly sanitation program to facilitate the proper cleaning of all areas of the food establishment. Provide the written sanitation program to an Alberta Health Services, Public Health Inspector for review.

2. The work referred to in paragraph **1(a)** shall be completed **immediately**.
The work referred to in paragraph **1(b-g)** shall be completed by **November 15, 2024**.

The above conditions were noted at the time of inspection and may not necessarily reflect all deficiencies. You are advised that further work may be required to ensure full compliance with the Public Health Act and regulations, or to prevent a public health nuisance.
